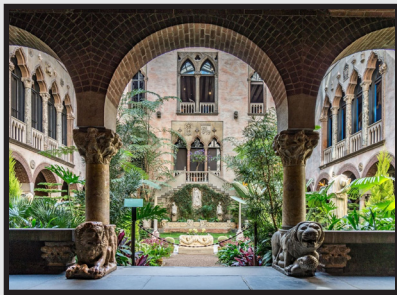
The library card account must be in good standing to reserve a pass, and only one pass may be borrowed per household for any one day. You are allowed to borrow each museum pass once every 30 days.
