


Jukebox Release Reception

49th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day Lecture with Professor Randall Kennedy

Tuesday, January 16, 6-7:30 p.m.

Randall Kennedy is the Michael R. Klein Professor at Harvard Law School where he teaches courses on contracts, criminal law, and the regulation of race relations.

Professor Kennedy is the author of the 2021 book Say It Loud!: On Race, Law, History, and Culture, a groundbreaking, powerfully reasoned, lucid work that is certain to provoke controversy, He takes on a highly complex issue in a way that no one has before, uncovering the long-standing failure of the

justice system to protect Black people from criminals, probing allegations that Black people are victimized on a widespread basis by racially discriminatory prosecutions and punishments, but he also engages the debate over the wisdom and legality of using racial criteria in jury selection.

He was born in Columbia, South Carolina. For his education he attended St. Albans School, Princeton University, Oxford University, and Yale Law School. He served as a law clerk for Judge J. Skelly Wright of the United States Court of Appeals and for Justice Thurgood Marshall of the United States Supreme Court. He is a member of the bar of the District of Columbia and the Supreme Court of the United States.

He was awarded the 1998 Robert F. Kennedy Book Award for Race. Crime. and the Law.

Tracy K. Smith, Author of To Free the Captives: A Plea for the American Soul Wednesday, January 24, 6-7:30 p.m.



Tracy K. Smith is a Pulitzer Prizewinning poet, memoirist, editor, translator and opera librettist.

She served as the 22nd Poet Laureate of the United States from 2017-19, during which time she spearheaded American Conversations: Celebrating Poems in Rural Communities with the Library of Congress, launched the American Public Media podcast The Slowdown, and edited the anthology American Journal: Fifty Poems for Our Time.
