4. **East Cambridge Conservation District Study.**

The Cambridge Historical Commission approved the Preliminary Report as submitted with the suggestions by the Planning Board that the boundary be reduced to remove properties fronting Bent Street and that Affordable Housing Overlay (AHO) projects within the district be subject to non-binding review. **Staff is processing comments from the Law Department pending transmission to City Council.**

Shady Hill Square (expires 2040). A requirement for public posting of park rules needs to be fulfilled. Attorney Stefan Nagel, an easement specialist, offered advice indication that the restriction may not expire after all. We will pursue with the Law Department.

VII. Publications

1. *Building Old Cambridge*. Four thousand copies were printed; as of January 31, 2022, 2,186 had left the warehouse. This includes 70 in the current fiscal year, 65 in FY21, 129 in FY20, 55 in FY19, 303 in FY18, and 1,564 in FY17. Lifetime net receipts are \$57,936.
2. Oral history publications. We are considering reprinting *Crossroads: Stories of Central Square* (2001), and *Cambridge City Hall* (1990), which have gone out of print. A recent Council Order requested a report on the feasibility of reinstating an oral history program that would focus on the Black community (not feasible with present funding and staffing).
3. Out of print publications. The MIT Press has scanned and released *Report Two: Mid Cambridge* (1967), *Three: Cambridgeport* (1971), *Five: Northwest Cambridge* (1977), and *East Cambridge*

(1988) as open-access PDFs.

1. Bronze maintenance. All municipal bronze plaques and statues are repatinated periodically. Weathering has been minimal, so we keep postponing from year to year.

Fannin-Lehner Preservation Consultants has been contracted to update a 2016 conditions assessment report of the Old Burying Ground. The contract has recently been extended through April 2024. **A request for proposals to conduct conservation of headstones is under review by the purchasing department and should be ready for posting by mid-March.**

6. Historic Site Markers.

- CDD requested a marker for Broadway Common (Sennott Park); CPA funds denied, put off until next year.
- CPA-funded project to replace deteriorated African American markers on hold for lack of staff time.
- FY23 Participatory Budgeting project awarded \$180,000 for Native American and African American markers (see below)
- Harvard University has requested an evaluation of the Louis and Elizabeth Agassiz marker on Quincy Street
- Maria Baldwin/Suffragist marker received from the Pomeroy Foundation, to be installed at Prospect Street residence.
- New Sparks House marker installed.
- Winthrop Park marker replacement. With financial support from the Mayor's Office, we have retained Indigenous historian Elizabeth Solomon to consult on this project.

7. City portrait collection. Most portraits removed during recent construction have been rehung.

8. Cambridge Women's History Project (Sarah Burks). Woman Suffrage research ongoing. Sarah continues to refine her Cambridge Women's Suffrage Timeline.

9. Cambridge Black History Project (aka Black Trailblazers, formerly African American Heritage Alliance; Leslie Brunetta, Melvin Downes, Chandra Harrington, Diahanne Lucas, Frank Lucas, Paula Paris, Kit Rawlins, Jim Spencer, Karen Ambush Thande)

- **The committee invited Elizabeth Solomon to discuss early Indigenous history in Cambridge. Elizabeth, a member of the Massachusetts tribe, has been contracted by the Commission to write text for new Winthrop Square history markers that will include the histories of Indigenous and African American peoples pre- and post-English settlement.**

10. Survey of Architectural History in Cambridge (Eric Hill). Misc. MHC Form B survey forms:

11. Historic American Landscape Survey (HALS). This year Allison Crosbie won second place in a national competition for her submission of the Gray Gardens subdivision designed by the Olmsted Brothers firm in 1924. Previous submissions include Lewisville in 2021, the former Harvard Botanic Garden at Linnaean and Garden streets in 2020 (first place), and Larchwood streetscape in 2019 (second place).

12. The 19th Amendment commemoration project. The winning project proposal was "The Future to be Rewritten" by Azra Aksamija: <https://www.cambridgema.gov/Departments/citymanagersoffice/100years/nineteenthamentcentennialcommittee/azraaksamija>, but the designer selection was cancelled due to concerns about minority representation. No developments.

13. Cambridge Advisory Committee on City Art, Memorials and Markers (CACCAMM) (CS and SB). This committee reviewed public monuments, memorials, and markers throughout Cambridge "to determine whether any of these commemorate those who were linked to the slave trade or engaged in other similarly shameful acts, (and) to determine which individuals - particularly

women, people of color, and those from other historically marginalized communities - should be newly recognized.” CHC staff created a web page for the committee, managed meetings, and conducted an inventory of existing memorials and markers. The Final Report of the committee can be found on the CHC website. No developments.

14. Mayor’s Summer Youth Program (KR).
15. CambridgeSide Open Space Advisory Committee meeting (AC). Allison Crosbie is representing the CHC on this committee, which was formed to advise the developers of the CambridgeSide mall on improvements to the Lechmere Canal Park. **Planning Board Review raised additional concerns, restarting design review; still not landmark eligible IMO.**
16. Harvard Square Advisory Committee (AC). Allison Crosbie continues as CHC representative on the Harvard Square Advisory Committee.
17. **Citizens Petition to Amend Ch. 2.78, Art. III. The Ordinance Committee will have a hearing on proposed amendments on March 7 at 12:30.**
18. Winthrop Street Wall restoration. Secured an appropriation \$200,000 in FY22 CPA funds to support up to 50% of restoration cost (estimated at \$435,000), conditioned on a) a permanent, engineered restoration and b) donation of a preservation restriction allowing public access. **Property owner Raj Dhanda’s attorney, Charles LeRay, who stated at the November 3, 2022 Commission meeting that his client wished to resume negotiations, has not responded to outreach efforts. Mr. Dhanda acknowledged receiving the staff offer but did not wish to respond.**
19. Inner Belt history. Volunteer Steve Kaiser has spent several years researching and writing about the history of the Inner Belt in Cambridge. The products of his work are featured on the CHC website.
20. Cambridge Indigenous History Project. Cambridge Indigenous History Project. Mayor Siddiqui has facilitated contacts with the local Indigenous community, but discussions about rewriting the history plaques at Winthrop Park were at a standstill all summer for lack of community engagement. Meanwhile a participatory Budgeting project allocated \$180,000 to commemorate Indigenous place names and other features of the landscape. We are developing relationships and forming a committee of Indigenous residents, historians, advocates, and language experts to steer the Participatory Budgeting project forward and to draft text for a new historic marker. We are meeting monthly and hope this group will become a long term advisory committee like the Cambridge Black History Project. Indigenous historian Elizabeth Solomon has joined the committee.
21. Accessibility. Eric Hill is coordinating policy with Manager’s Office and Disability Commission staff for producing documents and plans for visually impaired residents.
22. University Park history. Summer intern Henry Schmitt researched the history of the 1920s subdivision of University Park, a traditionally middle-class African American community in West Cambridge. We hope to create at least a blog post on this topic.
23. **Outreach. Spoke with preservation advocates and planners regarding proposals for NCDs and Demolition Delay bylaws in Northampton, MA and Bristol, RI. Explained how Cambridge reviews cases and what these tools can accomplish at the local level with examples (Eric). Advised Somerville and Springfield of Community Preservation Act programs (Charlie). Advised and consulted with CDD staff on BEUDO legislation and with Law and License on small-cell policy revisions (Sarah).**

3. FY2024 Budget will be mostly level funded except for COLA adjustments and a supplemental budget request for a new position of Preservation Projects Administrator to implement the African American Trail marker renewals, the Indigenous placenames project, the Winthrop Park marker renewal, and history station replacements.
4. The City manager has approved our request to post the position of Archives Assistant, which is funded solely through the commission's Mass Cultural Council grant.
