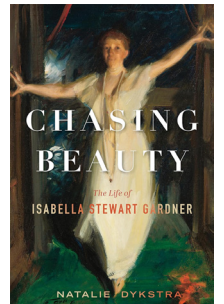
## CPL Presents: Natalie Dykstra, Author of *Chasing Beauty: The Life of Isabella Stewart Gardner*
