

LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR



True to its beginning in 1976, the **Cambridge River Festival** is an exuberant celebration of the arts in Cambridge. In those early days, a group of artists charged themselves with the development of an annual event that would showcase and celebrate the rich artistic traditions and activity that make Cambridge such a unique and exciting place.

The "Art Army," as the group came to be known, embarked upon wonderfully wild 'cultural guerilla raids' doing off-the-wall things like freezing plastic toys into giant blocks of ice and placing them in the city's playgrounds for delightful discovery by passers-by. They painted murals on sides of buildings and led mini-concerts from the back of pick-up trucks connecting artists and audiences - often when both might least expect it! In short order, the city's public spaces were alive and thriving with art all year long.

Fast-forward to 2015 and the mission of Cambridge Arts: River Festival is largely the same - support local artists and engage audiences with a dazzling array of visual and performing arts. As a tradition that both celebrates history and reinvents itself annually with the unbridled enthusiasm of artists, arts organizations, and one of New England's largest audiences. The 36th festival will feature **Peoples Sculpture Racing**, an exciting re-boot of the historic World Sculpture Races that were a hallmark of the festival in the 1980's. Don't miss the race launch at **Ilam** and be sure to see the sculptures and the artists who made them compete for the fastest race time all the while testing the fortitude of the fantastical artworks themselves! Following the race, the sculptures will be on display in University Park throughout the festival for your exploration and enjoyment. (See page 4 for more information.)

Join us on Saturday, June 6th in the heart of the city's dynamic Central Square Cultural District to experience the art and become part of this time-honored celebration. 





Their music is a raw pop rush of 60s dreambeat of Shangri-La's cool chic mixed with K Records lo-fi off-kilter production, smothered in hazy reverb.
