Jim – Public Works Department

- Project to improve Linear Park connections, including crossing at Mass. Ave. is re-starting
- Reminder to send final plan for May 21st ride route to make sure that there are no major construction obstacles
- Some sewer separation projects federally mandated for Charles River clean-up, some not.

Meetings -

- Read Cara's emails for meeting notices.
- Bill went to Arlington meeting. Meeting had huge turnout, estimated 300-400 people. About 50/50 pro/anti bikes. Proposed plan is to create cross section of 3 travel lanes (one in each direction + turning lane) plus bike lanes.
- Suggestion voiced for people from Arlington, Cambridge, Boston to talk about Mass Ave jointly value in having a consistent path/lane crossing all the cities
- Road diets, and related video, brought up. Idea of restriping the middle to create a turn lane like Prospect St. was recently redone.

Tree Planting & Placement

- City looking at plans to plant more trees placement matters. Some placements could preclude cycle tracks or similar in the future. (Really hard to get rid of trees once they're in people very attached to them.)
- Best if new trees in line with existing trees, rather than a new line
- Are there other ways of improving streetscape?

 - Other design elements?
