

The Grand Junction multi-use path will provide an opportunity for people to walk, bike, jog, or otherwise move along and enjoy a new connection between five Cambridge neighborhoods. The multi-use path will be constructed alongside the tracks in the Grand Junction corridor from the Boston University Bridge on the Charles River to the Miller's River Apartments in East Cambridge.

The first segment of the path was built with the Grand Junction Park between Main St and Broadway.



The Grand Junction Multi-Use Path Design Working Group members meet about every other month to discuss the design of the multi-use path. These meetings are open to the public. At the Working Group's third meeting, City and design team staff will discuss basic conceptual design elements, challenge locations for the conceptual designs, and public art opportunities.
