Grand Junction transit service is an important priority for the city

Studies and design projects that inform City's work

- Kendall Square Mobility Task Force (2017)
 - Recommended updating transit demand estimates, develop a concept
- MBTA Rail Vision (2019)
 - "Urban" rail with 15-minute frequencies West Station to North Station
- Multi-use Path project (Ongoing)
 - Designing a path assuming the presence of future two-track railroad


We will have a better understanding of transit service & design trade-offs

- Route


Some potential outcomes:

Mount Auburn at Aberdeen Avenue

Installing new signal equipment and making modifications to Mount Auburn Street

Changing traffic patterns on Mount Auburn St. and installing new traffic signal equipment Community engagement through summer; timeline for installation to be determined

Mount Auburn at Aberdeen Avenue

Several improvements are related to public feedback after Mt Auburn bus priority project in 2018-2019

- Extending bus-bike lane | awkward merge before bus stop
- Dedicated left-turn lanes | awkward transitions to continue on Mount Auburn

In addition, we will be making changes to traffic signal timing to continue to prioritize movements along Mount Auburn Street.

MBTA and State Updates

Upcoming subway diversions

Because of MBTA maintenance work and developer construction, the MBTA will have subway-replacement shuttles on:

- Red Line JFK/UMass-North Quincy
- Green Line
 - Union Sq and Medford Tufts to Government Center
 - North Station to Government Center
- Orange Line
- Lowell, Kingston, Middleborough, and Greenbush Commuter Rail lines

Weekends and evenings all month

New commuter rail schedules

The MBTA began running on new schedules for the Commuter Rail on Monday, May 22, 2023.

All lines have some sort of minor changes to schedules.

At Porter Square Weekdays have hourly service Weekends have 2-hourly service

Bus service reductions

- The MBTA announced that they will adjust bus schedules on Sunday, July 2, 2023.
- The MBTA expects that the schedule changes will make buses more reliable.
- Today MBTA cannot run all trips because they do not have enough drivers
- After schedule change MBTA expects to be able to run almost all trips with the number of operators they have

Schedules not yet published.

Subway service reductions

Since June 2022, the MBTA has increased the time between trains on all subway lines. Current regular weekday schedules are:

- Red Line Every 8 to 15 minutes
- Green Line Every 6 to 12 minutes

In Cambridge, Somerville, and Downtown **Boston**, Red Line trains arrive Every 7 to 8 minutes

Subway slow zone

Since March 2023, the MBTA has added new temporary slow zones because of poor track conditions.

On the Red Line, this means average delays of up to 30 minutes one-way for end-to-end trips.

In Cambridge, there are noticeable slow zones between:

- Alewife to/from Davis
- Porter to/from Harvard
- Harvard to/from Central
