



Cambridge Public Library to Celebrate the Release of *This Land, My Beloved: A Trilingual Anthology of Haitian Contemporary Poetry*

CAMBRIDGE, MA, October 18 - The Cambridge Public Library will welcome featured authors from *This Land, My Beloved*, a one-of-a-kind trilingual poetry anthology published by Trilingual Press, for a celebration and reading. The editors of Trilingual Press will host the event as contributing poets share their work on stage. A "trilingual anthology," *This Land, My Beloved* is edited by the prolific multilingual poet and editor Tontongi (Eddy Toussaint), author of *Tyaka Poetica* (2021), and prefaced by the National Book Award-winning Edwidge Danticat. *This Land, My Beloved* features the work of dozens of contemporary Haitian poets, including the former poet laureate of Boston, Danielle Legros Georges. The event will also feature music played by Joseph Chery.
