










Coolidge Farm and farmhouse as surveyed in 1870






Lake View Avenue, ca. 1950







12 Lake View Avenue, as surveyed in 1877 and 1909










12 Lake View Avenue Permit Set, #108905 First floor demolition plan, June 16, 2021. Heavy lines indicate walls to remain

The property owner, Homeowners Rehab Inc., has requested to extend the study period and interim protections until June 8, 2023 to allow further time for design development and community engagement.






