



NARRATIVE:

204-206 FAYERWEATHER IS A TWO-FAMILY RESIDENCE BUILT IN 1927 WITH A CONCRETE BLOCK GARAGE BUILT IN THE 1950'S. THE STRUCTURE HAS BEEN STRIPPED TO THE STUDS AND SUBFLOOR BEFORE BEING PURCHASED BY THE EXISTING OWNER. THE FOUNDATION IS A COMBINATION OF STONE AND UNREINFORCED MASONRY THAT WOULD NEED TO BE REPLACED TO BE BROUGHT UP TO CODE AS WELL AS COMPROMISED WOOD STRUCTURE. THE OWNER REQUESTS DEMOLITION OF THE EXISTING STRUCTURE IN ORDER TO BUILD WITHIN THE PRESCRIBED SETBACKS FOR THE NON CONFORMING LOT WHICH WOULD ALLIEVIATE CROWDING OF THE NEIGHBOR, INCREASE OPEN SPACE ON THE SITE, AND ALLOW MORE SPACE FOR THE OWNER'S GROWING MULTIGENERATIONAL FAMILY. A DEDICATED ENTRY TO THE LOWER LEVEL WILL PRESERVE IT AS A TWO-FAMILY INTO THE FUTURE.

We are long-time Cambridge residents and care deeply about the well-being of this neighborhood. Liza grew up nearby and attended high school here in Cambridge; her mother has lived here since 2000. Our family has lived in Cambridge for 4 years and we have been homeowners at Chilton street for almost a year now. We are writing today in support of Keya and Tom Dannenbaum in their application before the Board regarding the project at 204-206 Fayerweather Street.

We got to know Keya and Tom because both our families are cargo-bicycle commuters, taking our children to and from their Cambridge schools on the front/back of our respective bicycles. Keya and Tom have been wonderful neighborhood guides to us – recommending their favorite nearby playgrounds (especially the all-natural playground at Kingsley Park at Fresh Pond) and guiding us from our part of the neighborhood to the Minuteman trailhead by Alewife Station.

One of the things that was most notable upon first meeting Keya and Tom was how they strive to live their values, in particular through their commitment to no-car living. They told us they opted to not have a car for the first several years of their time in Cambridge (only deciding to get one with the arrival of their second child), and how easy it was to navigate on foot, bike and public transportation, even with a small child in tow. We understand that they have decided not to utilize the existing garage space at 204-206 Fayerweather for cars, deciding instead using it partially for bike storage and partially as office space. We don't know how many people would make that choice, but it does not surprise us coming from them!

In addition, Keya and Tom have impressed us with their commitment to staying close to neighborhood developments. For example, when their youngest child was just 6 weeks old, Keya told us how she attended community meetings (in the evenings, while still nursing her new baby!) regarding the new universally-accessible playground at Danehy Park. She relayed to us how moved she was by the presentation she heard at one of those meetings and how inspired she was that this new development was coming to our community. When COVID hit, and city budgets and general timelines appeared likely to take a hit, Keya and Tom were in touch with city council, getting the latest on the construction status and keeping us informed with updates. Dear Cambridge Board of Zoning Appeals,

I am writing today in support of Keya and Tom Dannenbaum in their application before the Board.

I have lived at 98 Alpine Street with my family for 15 years, across the street from Keya and Tom since they moved in almost four years ago. They have been kind and conscientious neighbors. What I'd like to share with you today is a neighborly collaboration we've had with them for close to a year now.

We have had a Little Free Library in front of our house for 5 years— a little red house from which neighbors take and leave books for free. At the start of COVID, out of concerns of transmission, we shut down the book exchange. A few weeks later we saw a note left inside, from Keya. She had seen a news story of people around the country converting their Little Libraries into neighborhood help stations, and she wondered if we might be interested in collaborating with her and her four-year old son, Tej, to do the same with ours.

What has transpired since has really blown us away. Our Little Library is now the "Alpine Street Pantry". For a while Keya and her son Tej were the primary suppliers of dry goods and non-perishables. We were honestly surprised (though perhaps should not have been) to see how regularly the pantry items would turn over; our immediate neighbors really needed this help. Before long, we were also so heartened to see that other neighbors (strangers, people we didn't know) had caught on, and were helping to add supplies. Now, every day, foodstuffs are taken and foodstuffs are replaced. It's a remarkable, self-sustaining ecosystem of need-meets-generosity.

I'm including with this letter a few photos Keya shared with me of her son preparing the pantry last summer and, several months later, continuing to do occasional restocking (in the photo, with his visiting grandmother). I am also including a note of thanks we received in the pantry late last year (along with a rough translation). I feel deeply moved each time I read it.

Keya, Tom and their family are wonderful neighbors who are committed to service, kindness, generosity, and improving the lives of those closest to them. We hope they remain members of this community for a long time to come.
