 - Shady Hill Square (expires 2040). The Law Department's consultant advised against claiming a municipal exemption under Ch.185 s.26. A requirement for public posting of park rules needs to be fulfilled. Trying to convince City Solicitor to retain outside counsel.
 - 38 Henry Street. Frank Shirley has offered to donate a preservation restriction on the exterior and significant interior rooms. No developments.
 - 4. Reservoir Hill NCD/HD study.
 - Commission jurisdiction over building permits in the study area expired September 30.
 - The study committee consisting of Peter Ellis (16 Highland St.), Bob Higgins (9 Buckingham/1 Highland St.), Arch Horst (55 Brewster St.), Brace Young (88 Appleton St.) and CHC members Joe Ferrara, Chandra Harrington, and Susannah Tobin continues to meet. The postcard poll was mailed Dec. 27, to be returned by Feb. 1. A rough preliminary count shows 25% in favor, 24% opposed, and the remainder not heard from.

b. Private projects: E&R Laundry adaptive reuse (Novartis); alterations to Gerald Chen properties, including 115 Mt. Auburn St. and 39 JFK Street; Twining Properties redevelopment of Quest Pharmaceuticals properties at Lafayette Square; Alexandria Corp. adaptive reuse of former New England Maple Syrup Co. building at Second and Linsky Way; **Harvard Collection to return Feb. 16**; affordable housing project at 1791 Massachusetts Avenue involving moving, restoration and new construction next to former North Prospect Church; adaptive reuse of 893-907 Main Street (Toscannini's) as hotel; 1-3 Brattle Street (Crimson Corner News and Tory Row Restaurant) to be combined for new restaurant.

c. Institutional projects: 11 Riverview Ave. being restored as Winthrop House master's residence (HU); **Kendall Square Initiative permitting (MIT), including buildings 1, 3 (238 Main), 4 (Hammett and MIT Press) and 5 (MIT Museum);** Winthrop House renovation (HU); Lowell House renewal (HU NR); Riverside Boat Club renewal; Memorial Church accessibility (HU 106); Friends Meetinghouse accessibility; Greenleaf House accessibility (HU); Radcliffe Yard art installation; Harvard Hall masonry; Loeb Drama Center renovation; **Biological Labs HVAC alterations (HU); Law School project at Mass. Ave and Everett Street.**

VI. National Register/Preservation Planning.

- 1. Orchard Street NRD. This nomination will be finalized as staff becomes available.
- 2. Harvard 106 agreement. No developments.
- 3. MIT 106 agreement executed as of September 1. No developments.
- 4. Digitizing Inventory. The Commission's inventory of all 13,000 buildings in Cambridge exists only in paper form and occupies 31 file drawers. We received a \$5,000 internal grant for IT projects for a consultant to help organize this project, for which we have a \$30,000 CPA appropriation on hand. We are designing a demonstration project with input from Cambridge assessing and GIS departments and digitizing survey files for a single block in East Cambridge.

VII. Publications

- 1. Building Old Cambridge. Four thousand copies were printed; as of Jan. 25, 1190 copies had left the warehouse, with \$31,847 in net receipts to the Press; the city's royalty will be 15% of that. We have talks scheduled at the Coop (sponsored by CHS) on Feb. 7 and at Porter Square Books on May 10.
- 2. Oral history publications. We are considering reprinting *Crossroads: Stories of Central Square*, which has gone out of print.
- 3. Cambridge Street Names. Volunteer Michael Kenney has updated a catalogue of city streets originally compiled by City Engineer Lewis Hastings in the 19th century. Publication is awaiting the new CHC website.
- 4. *Cambridge Mayors*. Kit and Michael Kenney are preparing longer biographies of the mayors and other city officials whose portraits hang in City Hall. These will be published as a booklet.
- 5. The Long-Ago Squadrons of Cambridge. Michael Kenny has written up his research on this archaic term used to describe land divisions in 17th and 18th century Massachusetts

VIII. Archives and Collections (Emily Gonzalez)

- 1. Survey Files Digitization Project
 - Had a helpful discussion with the HistoryQuestDC project and gathered information on how we can collect and organize our survey data. Will be creating a part-time job for a former intern to help with map and address research and data entry for our East Cambridge pilot project.
- 2. Office Reorganization and Collection Preservation:
 - Continued reorganizing office, assigning collections IDs to boxes, and prepping some collections for offsite storage.
 - Accessioned three new items into our collections (2 objects, 1 ephemera).
- 3. Outreach:
 - Finished eight new finding aids to post on our website; also posted three new photo collections on our Flickr page.
 - Continued posting semi-regularly on Instagram account: https://www.instagram.com/chcat831/.
- 4. Records Management:
 - Continued participation in the City's document management working group, touring group members' record spaces and devising a plan for a records manager/records plan for the City.
- 5. Additional Activities:

- 1. Bronze maintenance. All municipal bronze plaques and statues are repatinated periodically. Weathering has been minimal so we keep postponing from year to year.
- 2. Old Burying Ground. Fannin\Lehrner Associates resumed work on headstones this summer, and Dario Fiorentini restored the long brick tomb. Another partial headstone has been returned by a member of the public ("I have this friend, ...") and reunited with its base. Fannin\Lehrner also used a chain saw to free a 1687 headstone discovered in a tree stump.

We hired Christle Rawlins-Jackson as project consultant; she has met with the Heritage Trail Alliance and staff at the commission and the historical society, and is compiling an initial list of possible new marker subjects.

- XV. Budgets, Personnel, and Facilities.
 - 1. Fiscal year 2018 budgets are to be level funded; non-union staff to received 2.5% cost of living adjustment and 5.85% pension increase; each department is to develop new strategic goals.
 - 2. Anthony Zannino and Sarah Boyer are going off the payroll, but both can still be paid for special projects. Two student archivists who interned last fall can now be paid to continue working on the William Galvin collection and the digitization project.
