 - b. Private projects: E&R Laundry adaptive reuse (Novartis); alterations to Gerald Chen properties, including 115 Mt. Auburn St. and 39 JFK Street; Twining Properties redevelopment of Quest Pharmaceuticals properties at Lafayette Square; Alexandria Corp. adaptive reuse of former New England Maple Syrup Co. building at Second and Linsky Way; Harvard Collection to return May 2; affordable housing project at 1791 Massachusetts Avenue; adaptive reuse of 893-907 Main Street (Toscannini's) as hotel; Spee Club accessibility; Rush A.M.E. VI. National Register/Preservation Planning.

- 1. Orchard Street NRD. This nomination will be finalized as staff becomes available.
- 2. Harvard 106 agreement. No developments.
- 3. MIT 106 agreement executed as of September 1. No developments.
- 4. Digitizing Inventory. The Commission's inventory of all 13,000 buildings in Cambridge exists only in paper form and occupies 31 file drawers. We received a \$5,000 internal grant for IT projects for a consultant to help organize this project, for which we have a \$30,000 CPA appropriation on hand. We are designing a demonstration project with input from Cambridge assessing and GIS departments and digitizing survey files for a single block in East Cambridge.

VII. Publications

- 1. Building Old Cambridge. Four thousand copies were printed; as of March 25, 1,372 had left the warehouse. We have talks scheduled at the Chamber of Commerce on April 3, Google on April 13, the Cambridge Public Library on April 27, a Avon Hill neighborhood forum on May 9, and at Porter Square Books on May 10.
- 2. Oral history publications. We are considering reprinting *Crossroads: Stories of Central Square*, which has gone out of print.
- 3. *Cambridge Street Names*. Volunteer Michael Kenney has updated a catalogue of city streets originally compiled by City Engineer Lewis Hastings in the 19th century. Publication is awaiting the new CHC website.
- 4. *Cambridge Mayors*. Kit and Michael Kenney are preparing longer biographies of the mayors and other city officials whose portraits hang in City Hall. These will be published as a booklet.
- 5. *The Long-Ago Squadrons of Cambridge*. Michael Kenny has written up his research on this archaic term used to describe land divisions in 17th and 18th century Massachusetts (see *Building Old Cambridge*, pp. 273-274; posted at http://www.cambridgema.gov/historic/cambridgehistory)

VIII. Archives and Collections (Emily Gonzalez)

- 1. Survey Files Digitization Project
 - We hired former intern Meta Partenheimer as digitization/database assistant. She created a spreadsheet with metadata from our East Cambridge pilot project. The next step is to find an appropriate database or db provider.
 - Meeting with Jeff Amero from GIS and two outside vendors: AppGeo and Paul Cote.
 Currently looking into using Omeka and ArcGIS for our pilot project.

2. Library

- Emily Magagnosc has been updating the library inventory spreadsheet in preparation for proper cataloging and input into TinyCat (a cloud-based online cataloging system for the public).
- 3. Office Reorganization and Collection Preservation:
 - Sent several collections to offsite storage.
 - Meta is finishing the collections inventory of the library and office. Once collection IDs are assigned to everything, this inventory will go online.

4. Outreach:

- New photo collections continue to be uploaded to our Flickr page, including Gladys Boyce and select William Galvin architecture plans.
- Archives assistants post every Monday and/or Tuesday on our Instagram account: https://www.instagram.com/chcat831/.

5. Records Management:

• Continued participation in the City's document management working group, touring members' record spaces and devising a plan for a records manager/records plan for the City. We are currently reviewing an RFP for a records management company..

6. Additional Activities:

- Hired Emily Magagnosc and Meta Partenheimer as part-time archives staff. In addition to their duties described above, both have worked on updating various finding aids, rehousing collections and updating collection IDs.
- Supervising a beginner archives intern from Simmons. He has updated two finding aids on Charles Eliot and the Engineering Department, and is currently alphabetizing correspondence from the Ellis & Andrews Real Estate collection.
- Began to explore the digital asset management/finding aid database ArchivesSpace, which the Cambridge Room currently utilizes.
- Coordinating the final bits of 2017 Cambridge Open Archives scheduling; event will take place the week of June 19.
- Continued working with CPL archivist and CHS archivist on redoing the Cambridge Archives website http://www.cambridgearchives.org/ (ongoing)..

IX. Research

- 1. Researchers assisted during reporting period: 14; FYTD: 86¹
- 2. Cambridge Public Library. The CPA-funded Cambridge Chronicle scanning project is online; see http://cambridge.dlconsulting.com/cgi-bin/cambridge?a=p&p=home&e. A FY16 CPA appropriation has completed scanning the Cambridge Tribune up until it closed in 1967 and the Chronicle up to the present. The post-1923 Chronicle will be password-protected because of copyright issues.
- 3. Miscellaneous research projects: Maine Central locomotive 470's Peter Gray Corp. marker lights; St. James Episcopal's coffeehouse in the relocated North Cambridge railroad station on Cedar Street; Robertson Ward (1897-1990), illegitimate son of sculptor Frederick MacMonnies, architect and founder of the Mill Reef Club, Antigua.

X. Capital Projects

- 1. Bronze maintenance. All municipal bronze plaques and statues are repatinated periodically. Weathering has been minimal so we keep postponing from year to year.
- 2. Old Burying Ground. Fannin\Lehrner Associates resumed work on headstones this summer, and Dario Fiorentini restored the long brick tomb. Another partial headstone has been returned by a member of the public ("I have this friend, ...") and reunited with its base. Fannin\Lehrner also used a chain saw to free a 1687 headstone discovered in a tree stump. Cambridge Plant & Garden Club members may be interested in helping with maintenance/upgrading.
