We are designing a demonstration project with input from Cambridge assessing and GIS departments and digitizing survey files for a single block in East Cambridge. **Cambridge's IT Department is supporting up to \$8,000 in costs for a jointly-selected consultant to advance the project.** 

# VII. Publications

- 1. *Building Old Cambridge*. Four thousand copies were printed; as of May 26, 1,544 had left the warehouse, and net sales totaled \$41,279.
- 2. Oral history publications. We are considering reprinting *Crossroads: Stories of Central Square*, which has gone out of print.
- 3. *Cambridge Street Names.* Volunteer Michael Kenney has updated a catalogue of city streets originally compiled by City Engineer Lewis Hastings in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Publication is awaiting the new CHC website.
- 4. *Cambridge Mayors*. Kit and Michael Kenney are preparing longer biographies of the mayors and other city officials whose portraits hang in City Hall. These will be published as a booklet.
- 5. *The Long-Ago Squadrons of Cambridge*. Michael Kenny has written up his research on this archaic term used to describe land divisions in 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> century Massachusetts (see *Building Old Cambridge*, pp. 273-274; posted at <u>http://www.cambridgema.gov/historic/cambridgehis-</u> tory)

# VIII. Archives and Collections (Emily Gonzalez)

- 1. Survey Files Database Project. Following several meetings with our team and members of GIS and IT, we decided to go with a pilot project proposed by Paul Cote, contractor for GIS. The pilot involves setting up a database in Omeka software for our selected East Cambridge "test files". Our kickoff meeting will be in June.
- 2. Office Reorganization & Collection Preservation. Our Digitization Assistant, Meta, finished an extensive collections inventory of our office. We continue to assign collection IDs and are also sending off a large amount of Cambridge Planning Board boxes to offsite.
- 3. Library: Emily M., archives assistant, has been updating the current library inventory spreadsheet, in preparation for proper cataloging and input into TinyCat (a cloud-based online cataloging system for the public).
- 4. Outreach: Launched our new archives and library blog, updated weekly: <u>https://cam-bridgehistoricalcommission.wordpress.com/</u>. New photo collections continue to be uploaded to our Flickr page, and archives assistants post every Monday and Wednesday on our Instagram account: <u>https://www.instagram.com/chcat831/</u>.
- 5. Additional Activities: Emily M. created posters for Open Archives marketing (June 19-22); Began to explore the digital asset management/finding aid database ArchivesSpace, which the Cambridge Room currently utilizes.
