- 3. Preservation Restrictions.
  - Shady Hill Square (expires 2040). The Law Department's consultant advised against claiming a municipal exemption under Ch.185 s.26. A requirement for public posting of park rules needs to be fulfilled. Trying to convince City Solicitor to retain outside counsel.
  - Frank Shirley offered to donate a preservation restriction on the exterior and significant interior rooms of 38 Henry Street.
- 4. Reservoir Hill NCD/HD study.
  - Commission jurisdiction over building permits in the study area went into effect as scheduled on October 1, 2015 and will expire September 30.
  - The study committee consisting of Peter Ellis (16 Highland St.), Bob Higgins (9 Buckingham/1 Highland St.), Arch Horst (55 Brewster St.), Brace Young (88 Appleton St.) and three CHC members, Joe Ferrara, Chandra Harrington, and Susannah Tobin met on September 14, and will meet on September 29 at Washburn Hall, EDS. We hope to continue meeting every two weeks until a consensus is reached.

Institutional projects: 11 Riverview Ave. being restored as Winthrop House master's residence (HU); Kendall Square Initiative permitting (MITIMCo); Holyoke Center exterior restoration (HU); Winthrop House renovation (HU); Mount Auburn Cemetery gates; Metropolitan Storage Warehouse conversion to dormitory use cancelled (NR, MIT); Lowell House renewal (HU NR); Riverside Boat Club renewal; Memorial Church accessibility (HU 106); Friends Meetinghouse accessibility; Andover Hall masonry (HU); Greenleaf House accessibility (HU); 61 Kirkland St. masonry (HU); Radcliffe Yard art installation; Harvard Hall masonry; Loeb Drama Center renovation.

- VI. National Register/Preservation Planning.
  - 1. Orchard Street NRD. This nomination will be finalized as staff becomes available.
  - 2. Harvard 106 agreement. No developments.
  - 3. MIT 106 agreement executed as of September 1. MIT has retained PAL (Public Archeology Lab) of Providence to conduct the significance survey, with Wendy Frontiero as a consultant. **Preliminary staff review of findings commenced 9/21; continuing.**
  - 4. Digitizing Inventory. The Commission's inventory of all 13,000 buildings in Cambridge exists only in paper form and occupies 31 file drawers. We have been received a \$5,000 internal grant for IT projects for a consultant to help organize this project, for which we have a \$30,000 CPA appropriation on hand. We are designing a demonstration project with input from Cambridge assessors and GIS departments and digitizing survey files for a single block in East Cambridge.
- VII. Publications
  - **1.** *Building Old Cambridge.* Publication still expected in late October; we are hoping to schedule a release party at the Old Cambridge Baptist Church in November.
  - 2. Oral history publications. Sarah Boyer will continue to oversee distribution to local bookstores.
  - 3. *Cambridge Street Names.* Volunteer Michael Kenney has updated a catalogue of city streets originally compiled by City Engineer Lewis Hastings in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Publication is awaiting the new CHC website.
  - 4. *Cambridge Mayors*. Kit and Michael Kenney are preparing longer biographies of the mayors and other city officials whose portraits hang in City Hall. These will be published as a booklet.

#### VIII. Archives and Collections (Emily Gonzalez)

- 1. Survey Files Digitization Project
  - I will be setting up a meeting with various people, including Jeff Amero from GIS and some others from IT, to discuss moving forward with creating a "demo" site for our survey file database. In the meantime, I've continued researching other institutions that have done similar digitization projects. I've been chatting regularly with Morgan Jones-King from the South Carolina State Preservation Office, as she recently completed an online inventory database.
  - Met with George Stylianopoulos at DPW to discuss digitization strategies and ways to eventually link up our departments online.
- 2. Intern and Volunteer Projects
  - Two beginner archives students from Simmons just started their Fall projects at the Commission. They will be processing the Nylander family photograph collection, and working on processing the Cambridge Ephemera Collection and Cambridge rent control papers.
- 3. Office Reorganization and Collection Preservation:
  - I created a draft plan for a reorganization of my office (library and archives) space, and will be reviewing this with Charlie and Kit. This reorganization will allow for better storage of our archival materials and books, remove some of the collection overflow from the main CHC research room, and perhaps allow for processing space in the office.

- 4. Outreach:
  - Met with Alyssa Pacy (CPL) and Rina Sandler (CHS) to discuss the cambridgearchives.org website. We will be meeting again to save information from the existing site and then construct a simple Wordpress or Squarespace website that will represent our three organizations.
  - Began planning for a Historical Commission archives tour for city employees on October 13.
- 5. Professional Development:
  - Continued working on research for a "work-life balance" project for archivists, sponsored by New England Archivists.
- 6. Additional Activities:
  - Along with Alyssa Pacy, collected various materials donated by the City Manager.
- IX. Research
  - 1. Researchers assisted during reporting period: 5; FYTD: 40<sup>1</sup>
  - Cambridge Public Library. The CPA-funded Cambridge Chronicle scanning project is online; see <u>http://cambridge.dlconsulting.com/cgi-bin/cambridge?a=p&p=home&e</u>. CHC's complete run of the Cambridge Sentinel (ca. 1914-42) has been scanned. A FY 2016 CPA appropriation will complete scanning the Chronicle up to about 2000.
  - 3. Miscellaneous research projects: WWI Naval Radio School, history of the Fire Department for current Arts Council exhibit, Walker Evans's photos of Cambridge.
- X. Capital Projects
  - 1. Bronze maintenance. All municipal bronze plaques and statues are repatinated periodically. Weathering has been minimal so we keep postponing from year to year.
  - 2. Old Burying Ground. Fannin\Lehrner Associates resumed work on headstones this summer, and Dario Fiorentini is restoring the long brick tomb. Another partial headstone has been returned by a member of the public ("I have this friend, ...") and reunited with its base. Fannin\Lehrner also used a chain saw to free a 1687 headstone discovered in a tree stump.
