 - b. Private projects: E&R Laundry adaptive reuse (Novartis); alterations to Gerald Chen properties, including 115 Mt. Auburn St. and 39 JFK Street; Twining Properties redevelopment of Quest Pharmaceuticals properties at Lafayette Square; Alexandria Corp. adaptive reuse of former New England Maple Syrup Co. building at Second and Linsky Way; **Harvard Collection to return Feb. 5**; affordable housing project at 1791 Massachusetts Avenue involving moving, restoration and new construction next to former North Prospect Church; **adaptive reuse of 893-907 Main Street (Toscannini's) as hotel; 1-3 Brattle**

Street (Crimson Corner News and Tory Row Restaurant) to be combined for new restaurant.

c. VI. National Register/Preservation Planning.

- 1. Orchard Street NRD. This nomination will be finalized as staff becomes available.
- 2. Harvard 106 agreement. No developments.
- 3. MIT 106 agreement executed as of September 1. MIT retained PAL (Public Archeology Lab) of Providence to conduct the significance survey (see agenda).
- 4. Digitizing Inventory. The Commission's inventory of all 13,000 buildings in Cambridge exists only in paper form and occupies 31 file drawers. We have been received a \$5,000 internal grant for IT projects for a consultant to help organize this project, for which we have a \$30,000 CPA appropriation on hand. We are designing a demonstration project with input from Cambridge assessors and GIS departments and digitizing survey files for a single block in East Cambridge.

VII. Publications

1. Building Old Cambridge. Books went on sale
Nov. 7; the release party was at the Old Cambridge Baptist Church on November 17. Four
thousand copies were printed; as of Dec. 29,
1,060 copies had left the warehouse. The strongest sales have been at Porter Square Books, the
Coop, and the Harvard Bookstore, but it is also
available at bookstores in Brookline and Boston.
We gave a talk at the Massachusetts Historical
Society on Dec. 12, and we have others scheduled at the Coop (sponsored by CHS) on Feb. 7
and at Porter Square on May 10. See last page

- 2. Oral history publications. Sarah Boyer will continue to oversee distribution to local bookstores.
- 3. Cambridge Street Names. Volunteer Michael Kenney has updated a catalogue of city streets originally compiled by City Engineer Lewis Hastings in the 19th century. Publication is awaiting the new CHC website.
- 4. *Cambridge Mayors*. Kit and Michael Kenney are preparing longer biographies of the mayors and other city officials whose portraits hang in City Hall. These will be published as a booklet.

VIII. Archives and Collections (Emily Gonzalez)

- 1. Survey Files Digitization Project
 - Met with IT to discuss feasibility of setting up a survey file database within GIS and IT departments. Next up: template for capturing metadata from actual survey files.
- 2. Intern and Volunteer Projects
 - Supervised two beginner archives students from Simmons College this past semester. They finished several processing projects: Women's Commission Photo Collection,

WWI Naval Radio School Photo Collection, updated Cambridge Ephemera Collection, Nylander Family Photo Collection, updated William Galvin collection and finding aid, updated Lois Bowen finding aid, and several small photograph and document collections. These will be posted at https://www.cambridgema.gov/historic.

- 3. Office Reorganization and Collection Preservation:
 - Began reorganizing office and prepping boxes for offsite storage.
 - Re-housed several collections for more space and better preservation; re-documented small objects collection. Began assigning collection ID numbers to some materials.

4. Outreach:

- Historical Commission archives tour for city employees on October 13.

- Held an informal "city archivists" chat with Alyssa Pacy from the Cambridge Room, Marta Crilly from the Boston City Archives and Nadia Dixson from the Somerville City Archives.

• Participated in the reboot of the records management group, employees interested in finding a records management solution for City departments.

6. Additional Activities:

- Continued investigation into a cheap or free library catalog system. Applied for a library science intern to help complete cataloging our research library.
- · Received several new small materials in our collections.
- Sent various city directories off for rebinding.

IX. Research

- 1. Researchers assisted during reporting period: 27; FYTD: 67¹
- 2. Cambridge Public Library. The CPA-funded Cambridge Chronicle scanning project is online; see http://cambridge.dlconsulting.com/cgi-bin/cambridge?a=p&p=home&e. A FY 2016 CPA appropriation will complete scanning the Chronicle up to about 2000.
- 3. Miscellaneous research projects: New Balance Arch Support Co. (made its first sneakers in 1960 in a rented space on Cameron Avenue); Wayside Workshop, an Arts & Crafts enterprise on Norfolk Street; Harvard Square's first mall, seven shops in the basement of the Abbott Building opened in 1909.

X. Capital Projects

- 1. Bronze maintenance. All municipal bronze plaques and statues are repatinated periodically. Weathering has been minimal so we keep postponing from year to year.
- 2. Old Burying Ground. Fannin\Lehrner Associates resumed work on headstones this summer, and Dario Fiorentini restored the long brick tomb. Another partial headstone has been returned by a member of the public ("I have this friend, ...") and reunited with its base. Fannin\Lehrner also used a chain saw to free a 1687 headstone discovered in a tree stump.
