Alterations to Designated Properties

Case 3735: 50 JFK St., by 50 JFK St. Realty Trust o/b/o Amorino Gelato, tenant. Lower sill of storefront window; install retractable awnings and signs.

Case 3736: 39 JFK St., by Mayhaw, LLC o/b/o Warby Parker, tenant. Replace aluminum panels on canopy and install sign on canopy.

Landmark Designation Proceedings

Case L-126: 40 Cottage St. Roy P. Russell, Jr. and Robin M. Chase, owners. Consider petition of registered voters to initiate a landmark designation study.

Case L-127: 44 Cottage St. Charles E. Allen, Jr., owner. Consider petition of registered voters to initiate a landmark designation study.

Demolition Review & Landmark Designation Proceedings

Case D-1414: 7 RC Kelley St., by Kyu Sung Woo. Demolish house (1869). Review new supplementary materials regarding design of the proposed replacement building.

Case D-1431: 229 Concord Ave., by 227 Concord Nominee Trust. Move house on lot for compliant side yard setback and place on new foundation.

Case D-1432: 50 York St., by Just-A-Start Corp. Demolish fire damaged St. Patrick's Place residential apartments.

Policies and Procedures

Consider adopting a policy allowing the relocation of potentially significant 50+ year old buildings to achieve conformity with zoning setbacks.
