Commissioners, my client is looking to go into the location that was just recently vacated by Bol oco on 71 Mt. Auburn Street, which is a Mexican restaurant.

My client is an Australian-based entity
and this is their first vent ure in the United St at es.

They are an Australian company that sells
Mexican food.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: I was just goi ng to say, I was excited for a moment, l was Iike, Oh, I got conf used.

ATTY KEVI N CRANE: When I described that
in the past couple months, peopl e have asked me when the punch line was gonna come. But when you think about it, I guess Australians can have Mexican food.

They have substantial hol dings. 160
restaurants between Australia, New Zeal and,
Thail and and Irel and.
They are a phil anthropic entity. They
donate a meal for every one that they sell. It is called "Mexican with a Mssion." At this particular location, which has al ways been food on this particular stretch of Mt. Auburn Street, whi ch was important, particularly when we were before the Board of Zoning Appeals, we received a fastfood order Special Permit from the BZA in July. In conj unction with those proceedings, the Harvard Square Advisory Comittee issued a letter in support of our petition.

And for the record, l would like to
actually submit a copy of the letter, if that's okay.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Yep. Thank you.

ATTY KEVI N CRANE: I have submitted a copy of the proposed menu as well as a copy of the lease assi gnment from the present tenant to $\mathrm{my} \mathrm{client} \mathrm{with} \mathrm{the} \mathrm{I} \mathrm{andl} \mathrm{ord} \mathrm{consenting}$.

The hours of operation that we request are from 11: 00 in the morning until midnight.

There actually was, in front of the Advi sory Comittee, some feeling that we should al most stay open later, and $m$ client will be considering that once they get going as far as how it fits into their operation, as far as food del iveries and staffing goes and al so whet her there's a market for it.

And Mr. Anderson is going to be the
manager and he can explain any further operational issues in particular to this operation.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Why don't you tell us a little about your concept. STEVEN ANDERSON: Sure. So as Kevin
said, Mexican with a Mssion, so with every burrito or bowl we sell, we donate a meal to someone in need. We use a sous vi de style method of cooking so there's no grease-I aden vapor on site. We do no grilling, no baking. It is all done in a sous vide bath, which is water-based cooking.

We have three ni ght deliveries a week.
It is a one-stop shop, and PFG, they deliver all our meats and all of our produce and paper goods.

Very simple. And it is very similar to what
Bol oco had there before, but obviously, a much
cleaner concept both operationally and as far as
the menu, burrito bowls, nachos, superfoods, avocado, Spi rulina, we have bl ack rice. Very int er esting stuff.

occupancy of 36, calculating about 20 standing?

CHARLES LI NEHAN: Al so, for the record, l would like to say we have a 2 a.m license and we cut this off at 11 p.m to just satisfy anyone that may be strolling around the river, just so there's no confusion, and we do -- there's usually some type of sound engi neer present that controls, you know, that -- he doesn't control it, but he monitors the decibel and all of this for some of the music.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Questions?
ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: No.

I NTERI M POLI CE COMM SSI ONER BRENT
LARRABEE: So you are seeking a license for outside entertainment on a property you don't own?

CHARLES LI NEHAN: That's correct.

CHARLES LI NEHAN: Ri ght. We're licensed
to serve alcohol on the premises. We have an area fenced in.

I NTERI M POLI CE COMM SSI ONER BRENT
LARRABEE: Don't go too far.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: I thi nk -- I agree with the Comm ssioner here, I think I have no issue in terms of dealing with this inside.

In terms of outside, I woul dn't vote on it today.
I would ask you to submit something from
your I andl ord saying the outside area that you
are seeking to have this entertai nment would be fine.

Is the landl ord here?
CHARLES LI NEHAN: No.
ACTI NG FI RE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY:
Charlie, what do they have? Do they have like a 99-year lease?

CHARLES LI NEHAN: Yeah, it is one of
these things where you --
ACTING FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: it has been --

CHARLES LI NEHAN: I don't want to get
into certain things unopened. I would rather
talkin closed --
ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: It has
been there. How Iong has Marsh Post been there?

CHARLES LI NEHAN: 60 years, and this
basically has been, you know, going on, and right, it's one of these 99. I haven't been around this long. I'm not suggesting 99 years.

But forever. I have only taken over the Iast four or five years.

ACTI NG FI RE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: He
says they have a license. They use the outside six times a year, but if you want to issue a pending, I would issue a pending confirmation --

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: I thi nk the issue is, for example, l know that recently there was an event that needed to be cancelled because they had no permits from anyone, including DCR.

So । am -- I would be hesitant in approving the out door space until we get somet hing from DCR that either says yes, they can use the outside even if they have to apply with us five times a year, or something that says that
they have some type of permission to use that property, otherwise, I mean, quite frankly, I have no issue incl uding this entertai nment inside your premises at all.

Like, I would vote on that today. I know
that they have authority to be inside.

It's like you say, you have granted us, you know, permission to sell.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: If DCR were to say that we can't gi ve you a bl anket approval to use the outside, let's say that they say that, but they say you can still apply for every time you want outside for events, those five to six events that you have a year, that you have to apply to DCR to get, permission to use the space, you would have to submit with us a one-day request to extend your entertai nment license to the outside, okay, and we could vote on that, on those five to six events.

CHARLES LI NEHAN: That's the problem we had. I thought she would be here, Andrea. Where
sometimes we get notified maybe this afternoon
where someone wants to use it Friday ni ght or
Sunday, you know, what 1 'm-- within a short
period of time and we don't have time, you know,
to get these permits, you know, within a two- or three-day notice.

That's why we are here today to get, you
know, the extended one which we expl ai ned to them
that's how we had to do it.

ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: I s
there anybody you deal with specifically at DCR
for issues that serves like as a liaison al most to you?

CHARLES LI NEHAN: Not really.
You know, I can find this out, we have a commander and all of that. But we never have any issues. You know, that's the problem l mean, the issue we have is this --
ACTI NG FI RE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: It is
not a problem
CHARLES LI NEHAN: -- the septic system back ups, we call DCR, great, and they come down and fix it at no expense to the city. And like you say, how this came about, and you sai d we had a thing cancelled, $I$ was goi ng on vacation, we had an event with outside live music, like I say, whi ch has been going on for 12 years, it's the Somerville Striders, it is a running race, they have permits, DCR, State Police and the whole works and they run the 5 K around t he pond, okay? 12 years, this has been going on, you know, five times, it runs from May to June. On July 27, there was one of these races schedul ed, unbeknownst to anybody, we get approached by the city saying "Oh, you can't have this. You don't have a permit for it."

And honestly, l was blindsided.
"We don't have a permit for it?"
"The City of Cambridge said you have to have a permit."

This started the ball rolling. Meanwhile I was going three days from when I was notified on vacation, l was going away for a few weeks, and we rushed and we di d everything we had to do, as much as goi ng over and see Lieutenant Jim Donovan fromthe State Police over at, you know, DCR who just, you know, they signed off on this stuff saying you know, "Yeah, what's the probl em?"

So, yeah, if you could be so ki nd as to issue the inside, you know, for now, and, you know, l'Il try to notify DCR and just tell me what you need. You want a letter from them saying that you don't object?

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: I think I
would need a letter or somet hing from DCR saying
that Marsh Post has the authority to use this
area.

CHARLES LI NEHAN: The patio.
