Part I Total Crime

An analysis of the serious crime statistics for the first quarter of 2024 points to essentially no change in the Part One index total for Cambridge when compared with the first quarter of 2023. Through April 1 of 2024, there were 667 serious crimes reported in the City. For the same time period in 2023, the combined total for Murder, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny & Auto theft was 670 incidents, just three incidents more. However, despite currently being level with last year, a 15% rise in the crime index has still been registered when measured against the five-year weighted average.

Further analysis of the crime totals for the first three months of 2024 indicates that violent crimes recorded a 28% decrease when compared to last year. There were zero homicides, eight rapes, 20 robberies, and 41 aggravated assaults recorded through April 1 of this year.

Conversely, the numbers indicate that property crimes saw a rise in the first quarter, increasing 4% above the 2023 total for the first three months, with 24 more crimes reported in 2024. Despite a 62% rise in shoplifting incidents, a 36% increase in housebreaks, and a 14% rise in larcenies from residences, sizeable reductions in most other property crime categories were key to keeping the property crime increase relatively small.

When analyzing the serious crime totals of March 2024 versus the previous month of February 2024, there was a decrease of 3% in the number of index incidents, with seven fewer crimes reported.

Part I Property Crime

Analysis of property crime totals for the first quarter of 2024 reveals a 4% increase when measured against the same time frame in 2023 and a 19% rise above the five-year average of 504.

Almost all of the property crime categories are now recording decreases when measured against the first three months of 2023. Notable reductions in larceny from motor vehicles (-24%), larceny from buildings (-19%), and larceny of bicycles (-29%) were able to counter increases in housebreaks (+36%) and shopliftings (+62%), resulting in only a minimal increase for the time period when compared with the same time last year.

Part I Violent Crime

From January 1st to April 1st of 2024, there were 69 violent crimes recorded in Cambridge, 27 incidents (-28%) below last year's total of 96 incidents for the first three months and nine incidents (-12%) below the 78 crimes forecasted through March.

There have been eight rapes reported in Cambridge through March of 2024, which is down two incidents from 2023. The eight rapes thus far in 2024 have been categorized as four acquaintance assaults, two contact rapes, one domestic assault, and one blitz incident.

The trend observed during the past couple years of a high percentage of aggravated assaults and street robberies occurring in Central Square and on peripheral side streets has slowly begun to reemerge in the past month, after a lull in activity in that area during the first two months of 2024. So far, three months into the year, 10 (or 24%) of the 41 aggravated assaults and seven (or 47%) of the 15 street robberies have been reported in the Central Square area.

Shortly after midnight on November 23, 2023, officers responded to the area of 10 Magazine Street in Central Square. Two individuals with gunshot wounds were located and transported to a Boston hospital. One victim, 27-year-old Danasia Greene of Cambridge, was pronounced deceased at the hospital. The second victim, a 26-year-old male from Boston, was treated for non-life-threatening injuries. This incident marked the first homicide reported in Cambridge in over two years and the only homicide reported in the City in 2023. It remains under investigation at this time.

MURDER

No Patterns

- No murders have been reported in Cambridge in 2024 through April 1, 2024.
- Shortly after midnight on November 23, 2023, officers responded to the area of 10 Magazine Street in Central Square. Two individuals with gunshot wounds were located and transported to a Boston hospital. One victim, 27-year-old Danasia Greene of Cambridge, was pronounced deceased at the hospital. The second victim, a 26-year-old male from Boston, was treated for non-lifethreatening injuries. This incident marked the first homicide reported in Cambridge in over two years and was the only homicide reported in the City in 2023.* It remains under active investigation at this time.
- There were no murders recorded in Cambridge in all of 2022. This has happened only three other times in the past 20 years—in 2004, 2007, and 2010.
- In the last reported homicide in Cambridge prior to the November 2023 incident, on Saturday 3/27/21, there was a fatal shooting that occurred at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Pemberton Street. The victim was reportedly located unconscious outside his vehicle by a passerby who called 911. The victim was transported to Mount Auburn Hospital where he later died. The victim has been identified as Xavier Louis-Jacques, 19, of Cambridge. The investigation is ongoing.



RAPE

No Patterns

- There have been eight rapes reported in Cambridge through the first quarter of 2024.
 This is down two incidents from the ten rapes reported during the same time frame in 2023.
- The eight rapes reported thus far in 2024
 have been categorized as four acquaintance
 assaults, two contact rapes, one domestic
 assault, and one blitz incident.
- The total number of reported rapes tends to fluctuate from year to year, but the number of stranger-to-stranger rapes reported each year in Cambridge—typically between one and ten—remains extremely low.




AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

No Patterns

- The total of 41 aggravated assaults reported through April 1, 2024, is 24 crimes (-37%) below the first quarter of 2023, and nine incidents (-18%) below the five-year average of 50 crimes.
- The 41 aggravated assaults reported in 2023 were comprised of the following classifications: 13 domestic altercations; five unprovoked scenarios; four juvenile-related assaults; three each of shop owner/patron assaults and incidents between unhoused individuals; two each of the following: acquaintance assaults, workplace incidents, psychotic episodes, assaults on police, and landlord/neighbor assaults; and one each of the following: a traffic/parking related assault, an affray/brawl, and a bar/alcohol-related incident.
- The trend observed during the past couple years of a high percentage of aggravated assaults occurring in Central Sq and on peripheral side streets has slowly begun to resurface in just the last month in 2024, but incidents are still generally spread across the city. Ten of the aggravated assaults (or 24%) year-to-date were reported in Central Square.
- There have been two shots fired incidents reported in Cambridge through March 2024, with no injuries reported. Through the same time period in 2023, there was one confirmed shots fired incident, resulting in the non-fatal shooting of two victims on Washington St.






Geographic Breakdown of Aggravated Assaults: 1.1.24 – 4.1.24


Robbery

No Patterns

- The five-year average for overall robbery in Cambridge for the first quarter of the year is 19 incidents. Through April 1st of 2024, 20 robberies were recorded, which translates to a 5% increase over the projected total and a 5% decline below the 21 robberies counted for the first quarter of 2023.
- There have been five commercial robberies reported year-to-date in 2024. This total is down six incidents (-55%) from the 11 robberies reported through March in 2023 and is down one incident (-17%) from the fiveyear average of six. All five of the robberies reported year-to-date have been unrelated, but five of the six did involve shoplifting incidents across the city that escalated into robberies.
- Street robberies year-to-date in 2024 are up five incidents (50%) from the ten reported through this time in 2023 and up two incidents (15%) over the fiveyear average of 13. One incident citywide so far in 2024 has resulted in an arrest, and suspects have been identified in at least two others.
- None of the 15 street robberies reported so far in 2024 are known to be related, but multiple incidents in the Central Square area have involved unhoused individuals as victims and/or suspects. After seeing a relatively quiet start to the year in Central Square, street robbery activity began to pick up in this area in March. Three of the seven incidents reported this month took place in and around the periphery of Central Square, bringing the total to seven of the 15 street robberies (or 47%) year-to-date. This is similar to a trend seen in this area that began in 2021 and continued throughout all of 2022 and much of 2023.



After seeing a relatively quiet start to the year in Central Square, robbery activity began to pick up in this area in March. Three of the seven incidents reported this month took place in and around the periphery of Central Square, bringing the total to seven of the 15 street robberies year-to-date. This is similar to a trend seen in this area that began in 2021 and continued throughout all of 2022 and much of 2023.



Burglary

Sporadic Pattern

 The property index crime of burglary, the combination of residential and commercial breaks, has recorded an increase of 16% through April 1st of 2024 when compared to the 57 reported through the same time in 2023, and has risen 22% when compared with the five-year average of 54. This is all due to a 36% increase in housebreaks thus far in 2024, with incidents rising from 44 breaks during the first three months of 2023 to 60 this year. We continue to monitor a sporadic series of housebreaks occurring mostly along the neighborhoods that border Somerville. However, it should be noted that housebreaks dropped 61% from 23 incidents in February to only nine citywide in March, so this activity has slowed considerably in the past month. It remains to be seen whether this activity will re-emerge in April or stay at a reduced level.

 Conversely, commercial breaks are down by seven crimes (-54%) this year, dropping from 13 incidents through the first quarter of 2023 to six year-to-date in 2024. There were two related commercial breaks overnight from 1/24-1/25 in North Cambridge, where two females broke into a Dunkin Donuts and an office. One of the parties was arrested in Boston and has been connected to other regional breaks. (see map on slide 14 for more info on commercial breaks). The remaining incidents have been unrelated.








Geographic Breakdown of Housebreaks: 1.1.24 – 4.1.24

LARCENY

No Patterns

- Preliminary stats indicate that overall larceny year-to-date in 2024 is registering at 508 incidents, 4% above this time in 2023. The total of 508 larcenies reported in 2024 is also 19% above the 5-year average of 427 incidents.
- The larceny from motor vehicles total through March in 2024 is 66 incidents, 24% below the same time frame in 2023. At least part of the decrease in 2024 compared to last year can be attributed to a drop in catalytic converter thefts during the months of January and February. Through March in 2023, there had been 21 catalytic converter thefts reported, while so far in 2024, there have been none.
- Through March 2024, there were 21 larcenies from the person reported in Cambridge, down 5% (one incident) when compared to the same time period in 2023. Central Square has had the highest number of thefts with eight incidents so far this year.
- There were 46 larcenies from buildings reported through March.

 This total is 11 incidents (19%) less than the same time period last year and seven incidents (13%) less than the five-year average, due at least in part to a reduction in thefts from locker rooms at local health clubs so far this year.
- Larcenies from residences are up 13 incidents (14%) in 2024 when compared with 2023. Package thefts have made up the majority of this crime type in recent years and registered even higher than average in 2020-2022 due to the increased volume of deliveries during the pandemic. Package thefts have accounted for 74 (or 71%) of the 104 larcenies from residences thus far in 2024.
- There have been 51 larcenies of bicycles reported through March in 2024. This total is 21 incidents (29%) below the total through March of 2023 and 16 incidents (24%) below the five-year average of 67. The top neighborhoods for bike thefts so far this year have been Riverside with nine, followed by The Port with seven.



LARCENY From MV


No Patterns

- The larceny from motor vehicle total for the first quarter of 2024 is 66 incidents, which is 24% below the total for the same time period in 2023. The 66 thefts from cars reported through March also indicates a decrease of 24 incidents (-27%) below the 90 car breaks forecasted for the first 13 weeks of 2024.
- The neighborhoods with the highest larceny from motor vehicle totals through March of 2024 are: The Port (12), Inman/Harrington (11), and Cambridgeport (9).
- Comparing the last four weeks (March) to the previous four (February), there was a 72% increase in larcenies from motor vehicles, with 13 more incidents reported.
- Of the 66 incidents reported thus far in 2024, 29 vehicles (44%) were left unlocked at the time of the theft and 27 (41%) were entered via unknown means.





- Larcenies from the person through March 2024
 declined by one incident (-5%) below the same time
 period in 2023 but stayed level with the five-year
 average with 21 incidents. Three thefts were
 reported in the past four weeks (March), which was
 seven less than the previous four weeks (February).
- Eight of the 21 incidents year-to-date in 2024 took place in Central Square. The other incidents took place throughout the city, with Porter Square registering the next highest amount with four thefts, followed by Harvard Square and East Cambridge with two each.
- In recent years, higher numbers in Central Square have mainly been due to grab-and-run situations and/or incidents that involved individuals who are unhoused whose property may have been stolen while they were asleep or otherwise distracted.
- Two of the eight incidents in Central Square in 2024 have involved thefts of property while a person was dining at an establishment in the Square; three were unattended thefts, which typically occurs when an individual is sleeping or puts a bag down by their feet; two were pocket-pickings; and one was a grab-and-run situation.





LARCENY of Bicycle

No Patterns

 There have been 51 bicycle thefts reported citywide in the first quarter of 2024, down 29% from the 72 reported during the same time period in 2023. Additionally, the 2024 total year-to-date is registering at 24% below the five-year average of 67.

- The most recent four weeks (March) saw a 12% increase in bike thefts when compared with the previous four weeks (February), with two more thefts reported this month.
- Riverside has reported the most bike thefts thus far in 2024 with nine, followed by The Port with seven.
- Of the 51 bike thefts reported in 2024, 43 (84%) were reportedly locked at the time of the theft.






Geographic Breakdown of Bicycle Thefts: 1.1.24 – 4.1.24




Geographic Breakdown of Package Thefts: 1.1.24 – 4.1.24

AUTO THEFT

No Patterns

- The five-year weighted average for auto thefts through the first quarter of 2024 is 22, and with 24 reported so far in 2024, Cambridge has experienced an increase of 9% above the expected total. Conversely, auto thefts are down 11% (three incidents) when compared to the first three months of 2023.
- When comparing the most recent four weeks (March) to the previous four weeks (February), auto thefts are up 14%, or one incident, in March.
- The neighborhood breakdown for auto theft totals so far in 2024 is as follows: East Cambridge – 5; The Port - 5; Peabody - 4; North Cambridge - 3; West Cambridge - 2; Riverside - 2; Cambridgeport - 2; and Inman/Harrington - 1.
- There have been a few thefts reported so far in 2024 where the operator left the vehicle unlocked in order to deliver a package or grab food. When the victim returned, the vehicle was gone.
- 10 of the 24 motor vehicles stolen in 2024 have been recovered to date.


