Full payment is due at time of registration. However a payment plan can be arranged with the director.

Annual (school year) application Fee \$25.00

If you have an outstanding balance with any Department of Human Service Program, your child's registration will not be accepted until all payments are made.

Financial Assistance: Partial scholarship is available to eligible families. Please request a financial aid application from the director. Income verification in the form of W-2 or 4 current pay stubs must be submitted with the application. All information provided will be kept confidential.

Returned checks will be charged an additional \$25.00. Full payment must be received within 48 hours to avoid disrupting your child's program schedule.

Refunds: A full refund given if we are notified within 24 hours. Partial refunds will only be given if a child is no longer able to participate due to medical reasons. Refunds are not issued for missed class.
