 - Inquire as to whether or not they prefer a male or a female interpreter

- b. Eye contact
- c. Approach with an open mind
- 4. Literacy
- a. Some are illiterate in their own languages.
- 5. Race: Arabs with darker skin have reported having different experiences than lighter skinned Arabs.
