This 2012 documentary profiles renowned graffiti artist Tempt One, who loses his creative voice after sustaining amyotrophic lateral sclerosis. In 2009, Mick Ebeling and his Not Impossible Foundation brought a motley crew of international hackers and artists to Los Angeles to invent a low-cost, open source DIY device that allows Tempt to once again create art, using the only part of his body that still moves: his eyes. After months of harrowing trial and error, the EyeWriter was born and Tempt was once again able to exercise his creative muscle. Immediately following the screening, a panel of experts will discuss the film.

Note about parking and transportation to the Tuesday, February 4 screening of *Getting Up* at the Cambridge Main Library

Due to limited parking in Cambridge, we recommend taking public transportation if possible.

By Public Transportation:

Subway

The Library is located about a half mile from the Harvard Square MBTA Station.

Bus

The Route 68 bus stops just in front of the Library (Broadway and Trowbridge), but does not run past 7:00pm.

The Route 69 bus also stops nearby (Cambridge Street at Felton Street is 0.18 miles from the Library) and runs past midnight.

The Route 1 bus stop at Quincy Street and Broadway is 0.22 miles from the Library, and this route also runs past midnight.

The RIDE:

The RIDE is able to drop-off and pick-up from the Library's underground garage, which is the nearest vehicular access point to the Library. You may need to request that your driver use this location, noting that the garage is able to accommodate The RIDE vehicles, including high-top vans.

Drivers:

Please be advised that parking near the Cambridge Public Library is limited. However, the Library does have a 70-car underground parking garage with access from Broadway, including several disability parking spaces. The fee for parking is 25 cents for every 15 minutes, with a two-hour limit (vehicles displaying a valid disability parking plate or placard are exempt from the fee and time limit). The parking fee may be paid by using quarters or credit card (MasterCard or Visa) at the kiosk to the left of the doors leading from the garage to the Library. Please note the number of your parking space, as you will need to enter it into the kiosk.

In addition, the Cambridge Department of Traffic, Parking, and Transportation has granted parking consideration for this event, allowing non-resident vehicles to park in on-street resident-only parking from the hours of 5:30pm to 9pm within a three-block radius of the Library. Please note that this does not affect metered spaces, which are subject to the posted fees and time limits.
