General Program Information

Enrichment Program

Classes will begin on Monday April 28 and will run through Friday, June 20, 2014. The enrichment program begins at 1:55 with 30 minutes of outside play & snack. Classes begin at 2:30pm. Early Release day's classes will not meet. Please see enrollment sheet for sponsored trips, and enrollment information. Fridays classes will run for 90 minutes.

Registration Procedures

Registration will take place on Monday April 14th through Wednesday April 16th before 9:00am. Drop off your <u>completed</u> registration forms in our box located in the multipurpose room or the mailbox in the main office. On Wednesday our staff will do the rest! *For students in grades 1-5 please select a 1st and 2nd choice for day/time you would like your child enrolled.* Enrollment will be selected at random, and receipt of your child/children's enrolled classes will be mailed to your home address no later than Thursday April 24, 2014. Please fill out a separate registration form for each child. Forms that include combined children/class requests and information will be considered incomplete and will delay the registration process. Incomplete applications will not be processed. You will be contacted accordingly to complete the application and register.

Payment Procedures

Full payment is due when enrollment is confirmed. We do allow for monthly payment plan, so please inquire if this fits your needs appropriately. Payments by check or money order payable to the **HAGGERTY COMMUNITY**SCHOOL. All City-Wide Outstanding Balances Must Be Paid in Full Prior to Registration! Your registration will not be accepted until full payment has been made or a payment plan has been set up.

Financial Assistance

Limited financial assistance is available for income eligible families. Income verification is required by submitting a copy of W2 forms from 2013 or 4 consecutive recent paystubs is required. All requests for scholarship must be received by $April\ 18^{th}$. We cannot process financial assistance without completed forms.

Picking up Your Child & Child's Absence

Please be mindful our instructors have taken time to prepare to have your children in their class during the hours listed. Instructors leave after their classes

end and cannot be responsible for student supervision once their class is dismissed. Because students need to be picked up promptly, there will be a late fee of \$1 per minute after the class has ended. Please plan accordingly & pick up your child at the proper dismissal time.
