8. 16. 081.2(a), operating during a prohi bited period on J une 21, 2017 at 56 Concord Avenue. CHRI STOPHER YOUNG: I made that
complaint. Should I come up here?
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Yes, please.
Thank you.
And, sir, if you could state and if you could stand up, both of you, and if you could rai se your right hands, please.
(Parties sworn)

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Thank you.
Take a seat.
Just for the record, we did receive an
email fromthe owner of John's Landscape a few mi nutes ago basically, or an hour ago, with a response with regard to this matter, so...

Ms. Boyer, you can start.

ANDREA BOYER: Thank you. One moment.

So we had recei ved an email froma

Mr. Christopher Young that on Wednesday, 22nd of June, that John's Landscaping, out of Arlington, was utilizing a leaf bl ower in the back of his apartment, which is located at 56 Concord Avenue at approxi mately 12:55 until 1: 10 p.m

And Mr. Young actually sent t wo videos.

One was showing the gentleman in the back using a I eaf bl ower. And the second video was John's Landscaping truck pulling out of the driveway of 17 III ey Street (phonetic).

Once we recei ved that compl ai nt, we did a follow- up and scheduled it for a hearing to be heard bef ore the Board, notified the compl ai nant, who is here to testify today.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Mr. Young?

CHRI STOPHER YOUNG: Yes. I'mtrying to check that date but $I$ can get that vi deo again if
you need it.
This has been going on, I thi nk, four
times in the past year, couple years, something like that, that John's Landscaping is right outside of my building, you know, using the leaf bl ower in the banned periods. And the noise is -- Iet me just say one thing quickly, the noi se is nothing like 50 deci bels. I had a meter out there and it is accurate within five decibels. And it is 80 decibels. So, you know, this stamp don't mean too much.

And anyway, you are trying to catch up on sleep or just trying to do your work, l work at home, this is an incredi bly di sruptive noise and we' ve got have to enforce this law to give us some respite here because of the noi se burden in west Cambridge now with the jet noise,
hel icopters all ni ght long, you don't have -- you are al ways sleep deprived, you try to catch up on
your sleep and you can't with this level of noi se.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Mr. Young,
question: Were you able to -- I did get the vi deos, I know that you forwarded or Ms. Boyer forwarded them to the Board, were you able to -it looks like you're taking the video of the gentleman using the leaf blower from a wi ndow, is that correct?

CHRI STOPHER YOUNG: I went down there
too.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Okay, were you able -- and then I did notice that you took the vi deo -- I can tell you that Mr. Tig -- Tye. Mr. Tye or Tig.

I NTERI M POLI CE COMM SSI ONER BRENT
LARRABEE: Tig or Tye.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Yeah. He has admitted that the truck was his. He's
denying that the gentleman using the blower is his employee.

Now my question is: Are you able to see whet her the gentleman using the leaf bl ower -because fromthe video you can't really tell.

CHRI STOPHER YOUNG: If you check all the videos. Yes, I went down there and they got back into the truck and he was using the leaf blower. You know, no doubt at all. I think I saw himput a leaf blower in the truck.

At any rate, they all went off, the leaf bl ower and the truck, you know, went away at the same time. You know, this is crazy. Obviously, it was an employee. They are -- there were no ot her I andscapers there at the time. The truck was parked in the driveway of $m$ building. I can't believe this.

There were no other trucks that it could have come from okay? I looked around. I al ways
have to get out and go down three flights, walk around the back of $t$ he building and I look around to see if there are any other landscapers. I did a thorough check. There were no other

I andscapers it could have been with.
You know, they didn't use it long but the noi se, I was tired, trying to catch up on sleep and it blasted me out of $m y s l e e p$.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Ms. Boyer, is this address one of the addresses that is serviced by John's Landscaping?

ANDREA BOYER: 56 Concord Avenue and 17
IIIey Street (phonetic) is not listed on the properties maintained, which is filled out by the owner of John's Landscaping.

## CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: And then

there was something el se that Mr . Tig or Tye --
ANDREA BOYER: Stating about wearing the safety yellow shirts.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: He mentioned
that there's another company.
Did you look into whet her or not it was
the ot her company?
ANDREA BOYER: I apologize. You mean,

Johns's Landscape Desi gn of Arlington?
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Yes.

ANDREA BOYER: Yes.

They actually don't have a permit with us but they al so stated that they did not service any properties in Cambridge.

CHRI STOPHER YOUNG: Now, hol d on.

John's Landscaping, as I remember, was
the truck -- it was on the truck.
ANDREA BOYER: Correct. We are not
asking that question.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: No, it's
just that he had raised in -- in your email that you mentioned John's Landscaping Design of

Arlingt on and this gentleman's company is John's Landscape Service, Inc. also in Arlington but it is a different company.

CHRI STOPHER YOUNG: You know, I just saw
John's in the fine print. It is on the video, if you want to check it out. I got a close shot. I'।। go dig those up.

I mean, it seems awf ully obvious to me. I don't think you can get out of the fact it is one of those, John's Design or -- I don't know. I have to look at the fine print on the truck.

Same one we have had the probl em with the same Iogo. I know that truck, the white truck, and l know that logo, he has been something like four times in the past few years using leaf blowers in the banned period and l called him up and he's just blowing me off. Total disrespect.

I NTERI M POLI CE COMM SSI ONER BRENT
LARRABEE: Any ot her complaints on this
particular John's Landscaping Service, Inc.?
ANDREA BOYER: He has been fined.
I NTERI M POLI CE COMM SSI ONER BRENT
LARRABEE: Similar vi ol ations?
ANDREA BOYER: Yes. I believe it is in
the file. I apologize. I don't have that with me.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: He had a
fine in 2016 for using two leaf bl owers side by si de.

And then two in December. And then
operating during a prohi bited time, but that's -yeah, we have the operating side-by-side leaf bl owers.
(Indicating): Was this the I ogo you saw? CHRI STOPHER YOUNG: Yeah, that's the one.

Can I take a look? Landscape service, yup that's the truck, I remember. Another one that says
"I andscape design," I don't know. I remember
that truck. I would like hi m to observe the Iaw.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Thoughts?
I NTERI M POLI CE COMM SSI ONER BRENT
LARRABEE: You ready?
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Yeah. Questions?

ACTING FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: No.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: So, I mean,
I thi nk -- he does have here that he does service some address on Concord. It may not be 56 Concord Avenue, but I think with Mr. Young's testimony it is sufficient to find a violation and 1 would issue a violation with $\$ 300$ fine.

CURTI S BUTCHER: Curtis Butcher,

TED SHEEHAN: Ted Sheehan S-H-E-E-H-A-N.

Porter Square Hotel.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Mr.

Rafferty, are you going to speak on this?
ATTY J AMES RAFFERTY: Hopef ully not, but

I'mJames Rafferty and I represent the transferor i n Kaya-Ka, Inc, as well as i ndi vi dually, Gi m G-I-M, pronounced Kim who is a 50 percent member of the LLC.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Okay. Thank you.

Now, I think I figured out one of the
things that happened here because you guys filed
different applications because of the ABCC
system the actual description of what we are adding never made it into the system so my
question, my first question is: ls the
description of what was Kaya-Ka going to be the same description that you are inserting?

Because I di dn't receive -- I don't know
if you just gave it to us. I di dn't receive an updated premise description for this application.

ATTY SIMAO: The answer to your question
is "no."
And what $I$ have done is, actually Celia
worked into the description that Director Lint just read into the record, some specific seating, so specifically the description read in, in
reference to the restaurant, l don't believe that it referenced the seating, the 134 seats at the restaurant, 16 at the bar, and 30 outdoor patio
seats, so you don't have that yet, but that's based -- to try to keep it as streanlined as possible, we worked off of the description that was in the agenda.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Okay, so the hotel lobby, the foyer, the bar, restaurant, kitchen, that's all together?

ATTY SI MAO: That's correct.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Okay. So it
is not a separate bar at the lobby?
ATTY SIMAO: Correct. It is within the restaurant floor plan.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: I'msorry, I di dn't write down the numbers that you just gave us.

ATTY SIMAO: Just to highlight it, it
is -- within the restaurant portion of the premises, 134 di ni ng seats, 16 bar seats, and then the seasonal out door front patio, which is
i mportant to distingui sh, it is only the front patio, for 30 seats.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: And then
this patio is on private property, correct?
ATTY SI MAO: Private property, correct.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: So this is
going to be si gnificantly smaller than what was
there in terms of the seating capacity and stuff like that.

ATTY SI MAO: Of the prior restaurant operation, yes.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Okay. And then the storage -- well, it doesn't matter, because the al cohol service will be throughout the hotel.

ATTY SI MAO: Throughout the hotel,
correct.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: What are we
doing with the hours of operation?

Is it 8 a.m to 2 a.m on every day you I egally can and 10 a.m to 2 a.m on Sunday?

ATTY SI MAO: That's correct.

For the al cohol service, that's correct.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: That woul d
be 10 a.m (sic) to 2 a.m Monday through

Sat urday and then 10 a.m to 2 a.m on Sunday?

ATTY SI MAO: Correct.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Now, I'm
assuming, based on an email that l recei ved from Mr. Brandon late today, that the back patio, you compl et el y have taken of $f$ based on the Pl anning Board decision and in agreement with the nei ghborhood, is that correct?

ATTY SI MAO: That's correct. That's correct.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: And then
this back patio, l guess, l'minterested, is it
just going to be something that is open to the
public? Because I read the PI anning Board decision, and quite frankly, l know it doesn't really define these terms, but is this patio meant to be an influx of people regardless of whet her or not they are hot el patrons or not? ATTY SI MAO: That's correct. That was
the i ntent and the agreement wi th the nei ghborhood as we understand it.

Commi ssioners the letter that we sent to the proponents representing the hotel.

We appreci ated thei $r$ coming out and ai ring the issues with the nei ghbors, whi ch
included some of the abutters, and there was uni versal opposition from nei ghborhood fol ks agai nst the idea of opening the rear portion of the property, anything behi nd the hotel, whi ch is entirely in the residential zone, which, from the start, the devel opers have -- and l know there's been some changes in who represents who, but, you know, this would be a passive green space to serve as a buffer zone between the commercial activity at the front of the site, which is in a business zone, and the small-scale residential commity that surrounds the rear park garden, is how it has been described.

> And that's in the process. We were
assured of bei ng completed, finally, planted,
furniture, lighting, by the end of this month.
So they are currently operating the hotel
under a temporary occupancy certificate.
So we look forward to that happening, and
we're just concerned that once they are open
there be no future attempt to introduce the sort of I ive entertai nment, service of food and al cohol in this part of the property.

So we would ask that the Comission
consider imposing a specific condition that that is not allowed. And I know the premises
description, and your question $j$ ust now puts that on the record, but you may want to explicitly
indi cate that so down the line people don't think "well, let's take another bite at the apple" and fol ks have to come out again.

Al so, in the premises description, it was explained to us that it must include the entire hotel, and obviously, even though linen closets and maid closets and the garage are all described, we presume that there would be no al cohol service there, and it was indicated that they will not have room service delivering food
or al cohol but there will be mini fridges in the rooms where al cohol will be -- wi ne and beer will be offered.

Just a couple of final points.
At the original hearing l pointed out,
and I think, Madam Chai r, you may have
mi sunderstood what $I$ was saying, agai $n$, in the
advertisement for this continued hearing, the
Kaya Inc's d/b/a is described as Kaya Restaurant and, in fact, the Comission, a couple years ago, I think it was, changed the $d / b / a$ to Porter House Grill, so l woul dn't want that to introduce any sort of a snag at $A B C C$, depending on what thei $r$ records may say, so that might be something you want to make sure is squared away.

Oh, in terms of $t$ he capacities that were
just read, those are seating capacities.
I am wondering, is there an overall
capacity or is that just set, for instance,
standing room at the bar? Or people waiting for tables? Or parties in the function roomp And whether that would be specified.

Al so, l know that the Comission used to
require a specific di agram of the seating plans
that were signed of $f$ by Inspectional Services, and perhaps the Fire Department, so we would just want to be sure, there are sufficient aisles, i ncl uding the 30 -person front patio where the nei ghbors support the out door service, that that meets all the codes, including handi cap access and I don't know if they are required to have a certain number of wheel chair-accessible chairs and tables, and if that's within your purview, but that's the other item that we wanted to get cleared away and that's it. We really appreciate the proponents
coming and reaching out to the commity to di scuss what is going on and we appreciate the

Board continuing to hel p us.
l know you del ayed licensing some of the
el ectrical equi prent that we hadn't expected to
turn up in the park and that will now be
screened, but so thank you to all of you and
thank you for allowing me to address you.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Just for the
record, there are floor pl ans that are filed with the application; however, in a case like this
where the build-out has not been compl eted, the floor plans don't get officially approved until they submit them once and in accordance with what was expressed here.

M CHAEL BRANDON: Okay, that's good.
Just, there used to be, l don't know if it is
still the case, actually diagrams of the kitchen equi pment where the stoves will be, where the fire suppressants will be.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: They will
need building permits and they will need to
submit stuff to ISD and be approved and have Fire and ISD and all the inspectors that need to review them

M CHAEL BRANDON: I just hope not hing
falls through the cracks because it has for a couple years.

CHAIR NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Anyone in
favor of this petition?
Yes, sir, if you can please come up.
WALTER WEDLOCK: II Walter Wedlock. II
the director of the Masonic Hall Association.
Last name is WE-D-L-O-C-K. Li Re holy
matrimony. I have been on the Hall Association
for well over 15 years and have seen the
construction and build-out and been involved with
some of the things that have been going on with
Kava or Porter Square Hotel.
The back area, which l know, I guess, is
not -- the garden is not being passed or put onto this liquor license, which l think is appropriate, but some of the seating and ot her things they have for the area, I would really I ike to see those di agrams and pl ans because the upl i ghting and noi se and al so what separates the back of the hotel from the garden, and there are plans on the website by the architect but it does not reflect what is there now for space and design.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Thank you.

Anyone el se?
(No response.)

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Anyone in opposition to this petition?
(No response.)

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: I will note for the record we did recei ve an email on August 7 from a Candessa (phonetic) Eggrs E-G-G-R-S,
property owner near the Porter Road, and they were concerned with regard to the publicly-accessible garden in the back and so they just wanted to make sure there would be no spillover with the restaurant activities onto the gar den.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Thank you.
ATTY ADAM BARNOSKY: We are here before the Board on a transfer of a Section 12, all al cohol license, a CV Iicense, and entertai nment I i cense.

The proposed location is at 1248
Cambridge Street in Inman Square, the southwest corner of Prospect and Cambridge Streets.

It is currently the Iocation of Hops Test
Kitchen who took over the space in 2014 froma Havel i I ndi an Cui sine.

The proposed restaurant will be called Wts End. It will have similar beverages, fare, and entertai nment and hours of operation of Hops Test Kitchen.

The property was substantially renovated back in 2014 when Hops Test Kitchen took over for

Havelli (phonetic).
The licensee antici pates making cosmetic changes, some changes to the seating
arrangements, which were shown on the floor plans but no material construction or alteration of the premises is anticipated.

As a result, we are really seeking from
the board the same permits that are currently exercised on the premises, closing hour of 1
a. m , seven days a week, and 81 seats, which is a combination of $t a b l e s, ~ b o o t h$ and a bar, and we did provide a floor plan by LLM Desi gn detailing the seating with entertai nment.

> We are looking for standard
ent ertai nment: Radio, TV, audio tape and DJ one day a week -- I'msorry. Rather, trivia one day a week.

As for the proposed manager of record,
Peter Stein he's a graduate of Princeton and MT

SI oan School of Management. He previ ously worked in commercial real estate and project management in Boston. He does have experience in the restaurant industry. He is TIPS certified and he's schedul ed for a 21 Proof training on August 24. We'll provi de documentation after that trai ni ng has been compl et ed.

As the owner/operator, he does intend to be on site full-time at the restaurant. We di scussed the rules -- Iocal rules and regul ations as well as the state ABCC regul ations and his duties as manager of record.

As to a clarification, l want it on the record, for the application that was submitted to the ePortal of the ABCC, at the time that the LLC was filed -- or at the time the application was filed, the LLC had been formed but the proposed partnership agreement and funding was still being worked out.

Si nce that time, Mr. Stein deci ded to
fund and devel op the project on his own, a decision which was made with the consent of his proposed partner that was included in that application.

At the request of the Comission, we have provi ded two affidavits expl ai ning the -- that the ownership is now sol ely in Peter Stein's name, and if approved, he will have the sole beneficial interest in the license.

As part of this nei ghborhood outreach, we have been in touch with the City's Economic Devel opment Di vision and I nman Square

Nei ghborhood Associ ation about the change of ownership.

Peter met last month with representatives of the nei ghborhood association. They were supportive of the proposal. It is my understanding that they may have provi ded a

I etter of recommendation to the Board today.
We al so provided to Executive Director
Li nt now financial documents for both the LLC and Mr. St ein.

Happy to answer any questions the Board
may have.

Framingham? l'm al so friends with your son. We graduated high school toget her, Ian.

know that your license grants you more hours.
Ri ght now you have an 11 a.m to 1 a.m, and
actually, when 1 looked back, it was a 2 a.m
So 11 a.m to 2 a.m
I amfine with you not operating those
hours. I know that there have been past
Comissioners that have said the hours you are gi ven are the hours you have to operate.

My big thing is that the hours that you
are operating, you need to tell the public, and right now, 1 know it is on your website, but when you go into your premises, there's nothing there that al erts the public of those hours of operation.

And if you do not intend to operate anywhere near the $2 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}, \mathrm{l}$ think we need to address that, like, I know that l've sat on this Board now for a little over a year, and the consensus has been you need to operate the hours that you are gi ven, and if you are not, then we need to corral those hours.

We're not here to di scuss that now, but l wanted to tell you that at least until, whatever happens, you need to put on your prem se door the hours that you are operating so the public knows. Thank you.

ATTY KEVI N CRANE: The actual hours they are operating?

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Yes, the actual hours that you are operating.

ATTY KEVI N CRANE: Okay, the license, you said, goes to 2 a.m?

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: No. The Iiquor license currently that you have is 11 a.m to 1 a.m, seven days a week. When l went back, because -- so the only reason l know this is because our inspectors went to inspect your premi ses and we had given them the hours of operation and they went at midni ght and they are like "oh, no, they are closed" and then they went
on-I i ne and they saw that you have different
hours and so l pulled out the record of when your I i cense was granted, and that is where I saw the hours.

ATTY KEVI N CRANE: The website should say

1 a.m?

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: No. The
website should say the hours he's operating and it does. It goes and complies to what Mr. Brush testified to.

I' m saying at the door, not everybody
goes on a website and looks up your hours, so the publ ic needs to know the hours you are operating.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Good
afternoon. Pl ease --
PAUL OVERGAAG: Good afternoon,
Commission.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: PI ease state
and spell your names -- name for the record.
PAUL OVERGAAG: My name is Paul Overgaag
O-V-E-R-G-A-A-G. I'mthe owner of Charlie's
Kitchen and The Red House Restaurant in
Cambridge.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Thank you.
PAUL OVERGAAG: I have some Iarger prints
for you fol ks, if you would like to take a look at the floor plan.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Why not.
Thank you.
PAUL OVERGAAG: So just to start with a little bit of history. Paul Overgaag has been a Iicense hol der in Cambridge for over 30 years. Peopl e used to know me in the Charles Hotel at Gi ani no's (phonetic). After that, I took over Charlie's Kitchen and then we devel oped The Red House Restaurant.

Four years ago l got invol ved with medical marijuana, and we currently have a grow facility and dispensary open in Georgetown, and I ast summer, I petitioned the City Council in Cambridge to rezone the medical marijuana to include Harvard Square, and they asked me to please not take over the whole building for the di spensary but try to keep a small restaurant to
mai nt ai $n$ the restaurant-feel on $W$ nt hrop Street.

So we redesi gned everything, made the di spensary a little smaller and came up with a design for the restaurant to co-locate in the same building, as two separate units, a di spensary and a restaurant.

There's no way to access the di spensary from the restaurant or vice-versa.

W th me, I have my attorney from-- who
does the medical marijuana, if there's any questions that the Board has about that particular part of the operation.

In the meantime, it has been ten years
since l have been i n front of the Commission, and so a lot of the rules and regul ations have changed, and so we went to the Fire Department and worked with Fire Prevention to recalculate the occupancy and seating and came up with different numbers that are reflected in these
pl ans here today.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Okay, so
that was actually one of my questions.
So what hall way are you removing?
I mean -- and you are removing that first
floor bathroom so when The Red House people want
to go to the bathroom whi ch bathroom are they
going to use?
PAUL OVERGAAG: If you go to plan A13, I
hi ghl ighted the dispensary part in yellow.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Okay.

PAUL OVERGAAG: So the hall way to the
back di spensary is the hall way we are removing from The Red House.

The back roomis the dining roomthat we are removing from The Red House.

We are removing one bathroom from The Red
House and that becomes the bathroom to the
restaurant. That's uni sex, handi capped
accessible.

Then on the second floor, there will be a bat hroom for The Red House that is not handicap accessible and we've applied for a vari ance.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Now, let me see if l can envision this in my head.

When I wal k into The Red House, the hostess stand is a little bit to the right, and there's a bathroom there and then there's the back room

PAUL OVERGAAG: Yep.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Al I that is
stayi ng Red House?

PAUL OVERGAAG: The hall way, there's t wo bat hrooms there, we're changing the door entrance to have the door entrance be where the podi um currently is, that whole wall will be blocked off and the main entrance for The Red House will be on the patio side.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: So you woul d be entering the other -- okay, I see.

PAUL OVERGAAG: You woul d be entering
into the bar area through the patio. We made the patio handi capped accessible to follow that route to get into the smaller restaurant.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Okay, and
then the entire second floor of The Red House is now gone?

PAUL OVERGAAG: No.

The second story of The Red House consists of three rooms and a bathroom

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Okay.
PAUL OVERGAAG: The two front rooms will be taken over by the Heal thy Pharms' tenant.

One of the rooms will be an office.
One will be a security server room

The third room will be a storage room
that is publicly accessible to the second
bathroom on the third floor -- or second floor.
I'msory.
I don't think there's any third floor pl ans in there.

ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY:
Drawing Al3 is the first floor?
PAUL OVERGAAG: First floor of The Red
House.
ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: So
your separate tenant will have space on floor 1
as well as floor 2?
PAUL OVERGAAG: Yes, sir.
ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: So you
have a --

PAUL OVERGAAG: Unf ortunately, there's
no --
ACTI NG FI RE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY:
There's no drawing for floor 2.
PAUL OVERGAAG: I'm sorry about that.

## ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: I

think -- well, there's a drawing just for upstairs at Charlie's.

PAUL OVERGAAG: Upstairs at Charlie's is the same license but a different building.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: But
Charlie's is not -- you are not changing
Charlie's description at all, this is just
happening at The Red House?
PAUL OVERGAAG: Ri ght. We are changing
the occupancy count at Charlie's.
ACTI NG FI RE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: You
cannot go between Charlie's and Red House?
PAUL OVERGAAG: As a customer, no. As employees, yes.

ACTI NG FI RE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY:
Wthin -- without going out of doors.
PAUL OVERGAAG: Yes.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Through the

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back stairs.
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ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: Okay. PAUL OVERGAAG: You are very well aware of the building.

ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: That's
her job.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: So, right
now, your premise, right now is described as
three dining rooms, bar lounge, bar, kitchen, garden patio, terrace patio on first floor, so your first floor is now becoming two rooms basically? Yes?

PAUL OVERGAAG: Yes. Two rooms and an
out door patio.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: And then the second floor fromthree dining rooms, you are going to one room but that one roomis not a di ni ng room?

PAUL OVERGAAG: Not a di ning room

## CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Just

storage.
PAUL OVERGAAG: Liquor storage in a cage
and a bathroom
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Oh, I see.
And that's why you say it is accessible to the public because they can use the bathroom

PAUL OVERGAAG: I needed that bat hroom count for the pl unbing code.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: And your patio, which you al so changed to make handicap accessible, what will be the capacity on that patio now?

PAUL OVERGAAG: The patio, we're looking for 50 seats -- 44 seats. That's A1, 3A.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: This is the one in front of The Red House?

PAUL OVERGAAG: Yes, ma' am
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Then you
said that the Charlie's is al so changing the capacity, the occupancy?

PAUL OVERGAAG: Because the cal cul ation
of the occupancy ten years ago was just how many
tables you can put in. We recal culated
everything with the 15-square-foot-per-seating customer and 7 square feet for standing customer, so we came up with a different occupancy loads
than what is actually happening right now.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Okay, so
what is going to be the change in Charlie's?
PAUL OVERGAAG: That's where we had the difficulties because we could never identify what the occupancy was before we did this.

There was no occupancy load on the beer garden. It was al ways -- it was a number.

Now, with the calculations, it is
clarified that the beer garden is proposed to hol d 124 people, if I have that number correct.

Yes.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Which one is
that?
PAUL OVERGAAG: A10.

ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: On the front sheet.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Oh.

PAUL OVERGAAG: So we have tables, we
have fixed tables and backbar staff, which, as l
just found out from you right now, should not be counted into that. Stools and standing coming out to 124.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Okay.
PAUL OVERGAAG: Not to start a whole
other di scussion, but because of the
ever-changing need of the restaurant space at
I unchtime, it is all seated that people want to
sit. At di nnertime until 8:00 at ni ght, it is peopl e that want to have dinner. At 9:00, 10:00,
it is people that want to stand around and hang around and have drinks.

There was some di scussion with the Fire
Prevention officer that l should question if we
take tables away at that particular time and properly store these tables, would we then have a floating capacity because if you take away two chairs, you can increase your standing capacity by four people.

ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: I don't --

PAUL OVERGAAG: l'm saying -- l'm
underlying "properly stored." So not just stack them in the egress.

ACTI NG FI RE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY:
Properly stored where?
PAUL OVERGAAG: On the third floor that we have available.

And vice-versa on the insi de of

Charlie's, especially on the second floor.
ACTI NG FI RE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: So my
concern would be that you have $X$ people in the establishment based on more square footage available for standing and then you bring tables and chairs in, now you reduced your available -your allowable floor limit and what happens to the people that are al ready there?

PAUL OVERGAAG: At 8:00 at ni ght, there's
a bunch of empty tables, that you then take away and create standing room

ACTI NG FI RE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: So I et me ask you something: So while your restaurant is occupied, conducting business, you are going to have people, workers pack up tables and chairs and maneuver themto the third floor --

PAUL OVERGAAG: Yeah.
ACTI NG FI RE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY:
-- while you have guests in the restaurant?

PAUL OVERGAAG: The second floor of
Charlie's is a perfect example where the stai rcase is at the -- in the roomitself and we can designate four tables to disappear every ni ght.

So we stop seating there at 8:00 at ni ght, take those four tables away, and those are four tables that seat six people, so you are tal king technically an increase of 24 standing peopl e.

And the reason l bring this up because there's al ways this capacity issue that happens at that particular time at ni ght where you don't -- people don't want to sit.

ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: Right.
PAUL OVERGAAG: You have a ton of people standing but nobody is sitting at the table.

ACTI NG FI RE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: I
underst and.

PAUL OVERGAAG: And I know it is a much
bi gger discussion and I think we should not cloud the issue today, but l would definitely like to discuss this in a fut ure discussion to see if there's a possi bility to say, okay, you have -this is your plan, if you have - instead of 80 people sitting, you have 60 people sitting and you can have 70 people standing and have a chart and have the chart be the chart we live by.

ACTI NG FIRE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: Okay. PAUL OVERGAAG: Just --

ACTI NG FI RE CHI EF GERARD MAHONEY: I
think it is worthy of a discussion.
PAUL OVERGAAG: Thank you.

M CHAEL BRANDON: That's different from
the Harvard Square Advisory Committee, which is
an of ficial body.
PAUL OVERGAAG: It's the Harvard Economic Advisory Comittee, which we had a presentation in front and they unani mously approved the project. John Di Gi ovanni is the president of that committee.

M CHAEL BRANDON: I -- I don't think
"economy" is part of it, but just to correct what was said, the Harvard Square Defense Fund has now morphed i nto the Harvard Square Nei ghbor hood Association and I suspect that you haven't been before them $I$ just recommend that you think about maybe doing so.

I icense in, which we did, and pursuant to that, this hearing was scheduled, and you and $I$ had a conversation yesterday and emails about falling into that category and the necessary -- how necessary it was, or was not, and I amclear now, and we are in the midst of negotiations with Harvard vi a attorneys about the issue -- the reason we closed, which it wasn't disclosed to us that they were closing the street until August of 2018 whi ch hampered our busi ness.

We appreci ate the accolades we received
from all the media, The Globe, the Boston
Magazine, the endorsement by the City Council of Cambridge, as well as our customers, but our business just never continued to grow where we needed it to grow and we were al erted in February of this year that Harvard is keeping the street closed until August of 2018, which we got an at torney invol ved and found out that they legally
had to disclose it to us that they were going to close the street, and therefore, the attorneys are trying to hash this out. If not, we'll be filing a complaint and litigation. And at which point, when we file the complaint, we'll pursue ot her opportunities with the license throughout the city to try to find a home for it. CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: To clarify, for the record, what Mr. Goodwin is referring to in terms of our conversation of yesterday, was I was revi ewing the file and l observed that his Iiquor license was in the file, and l was asking hi $m$ why it was here and whether he had rel inqui shed the license, and his response was "no" that he was informed he had to turn in the Iicense, which is a practice for the hackney licenses, not the liquor licenses.

And I provided himthe rules and
regul ations just saying that he needed to inform
the Board that he had closed, not that he needed to provide the license to the Board and I just want clarification on that.

So with that said -- and then my
question, l think, you just answered is, if you don't really see an end in sight in terms of this, you are thinking of moving the license somewhere el se and putting it into use?

Hana Sushi, a Japanese restaurant, the
proponent's restaurant Joe Sent Me cafe, bar, restaurant, so at one poi nt when the Greek
restaurant wanted to open -- add wi ne and beer,
there was a controversy over the dumpsters behi nd
this venue and the adjacent one, whi ch were not
very well kept up, and they weren't locked.

Subsequently, wi thi $n$ the last year, there
was bad -- there was a bad out break of rat
i nfestations, l argel y emanating from these
dumpsters, whi ch spread to the residences on

Dudl ey Street, i mmedi at el y behi nd them

I nspectional Services did do a lot of
work trying to crack down and exterminating.

I think the city even brought in and paid for exterminators of the residential property.

So it's -- from what I've heard, the
probl em is pretty much all evi ated. Al though I, once in a while, will see a rodent when l walk down Dudl ey Street.

I would just caution that the proponents be sure to regul arly make sure that those dumpsters are kept covered at ni ght, regul arly serviced and emptied and sanitized and that the alleyway is al ways kept locked so we don't devel op any problems.

Ot her than that, I'mreally glad. I've had dimsum there more than once and hope that you would grant this permit.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Thank you. ANDREA BOYER: -- by phone.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Mr. Kusce?
J OSEPH KUSCE: We do have a property that we take care of at 52 and 54 Trowbridge Street, whi ch is a double condo with a courtyard in the middle, brick courtyard in the middle.

We do have a license for using the leaf bl owers in the correct season and we do have the appropriate bl owers for such. I would say that
if the guys were using their own blowers --
because we only do a few towns (sic) in
Cambridge.
Coming from Bel mont and going to
Watertown or Arlington then they probably were using some blowers to clean up the debris on the street or the sidewalk. I did tell them not to use them this year after June 15 and before

September 15. Similar rules apply in Arlington as well, and you know, they just may have done it without my notice. I'm not at every job because

I have 125 homes that I run and I have 12-- 11
to 12 men that work for me.
CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Answer me
this question: Did you talk to your employees
after you got notice of this hearing?
J OSEPH KUSCE: Did I speak to them
afterwards?

Landscape submitted a very detailed response to this, so l was not expecting them l'm not sure,

Ms. Boyer, did they tell you that they were going
to appear because it appears this is their response to the compl ai nt.

ANDREA BOYER: That's what he stated to
me. He didn't want to seem as if he was
disinterested but that he issued a statement and he would pretty much say the exact same thing that was in his statement al ong with the picture of --

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Is the compl ai nant here?

ANDREA BOYER: The compl ai nant is City
Councillor Jan Devereux and she submitted a written statement to be read into the record.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Could you please read it?

ANDREA BOYER: Yes, l will. "On July 10 shortly before 10 a.m, l was on my way to a meeting in Harvard Square when $I$ heard and observed a leaf bl ower being used to sweep dirt from a sidewal k i n front of Harvard's Greenl eaf House on 76 Brattle Street.

A Cambridge Landscape truck was parked
there and workers were loading equi pment into it.

As they appeared to be finished with
thei $r$ j ob, except for the clean up that i nvolved bl owing dirt on the sidewal k, l politely informed one of them that leaf bl owers are not to be used this time of year and never to bl ow dirt on the si dewal k. He made a face and waved me away and said somet hing under his breath, whi ch l couldn't underst and.

The person operating the blower was a far di stance away on the si dewal $k$ and $l$ di dn' $t$ want to chase after himsol continued on my way in the ot her di rection."

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: And then do you have the Cambridge Landscape response there?

ANDREA BOYER: I do.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: If you could read it into the record, please.

ANDREA BOYER: "Dear Ms. Boyer: I'min
recei pt of your letter regarding the leaf blower ordinance viol ation on $J u l y$ via a Cambridge Landscape Company empl oyee.

I have i nt erviewed the empl oyees who were on the site that day and have been made aware
that our on-site ground person at the Radcliffe (i naudi ble) did, in fact, operate a blower that he had stored on campus that day.

Our empl oyee readily admitted to using
the bl ower fully knowing it was illegal to do so. He was -- he had written a letter
apologizing for his bad judgment and is
empat hetic, however, that no one approached him to di scuss his use of the bl ower.

I understand that as the owner/oper at or
of Cambridge Landscape, l'm responsi ble for the actions of my employees and that this is a clear viol ati on of the or di nance.

This incident has caused us to reexami ne
our approach to conforming to the ordi nance. We have removed all bl owers stored on site at

Cambridge properties, the presence of which were oversight on my part.

We are setting up Cambridge-onl y mowing
routes whose crew will not be allowed to have leaf bl owers on their vehicles in addition to our regul ar practices, reiterating the effective dates of $t$ he ordinance at weekl y company meetings, placing notices, listing municipalities that have instituted bl ower bans next to our time clock and at the entrance to our offices and monitoring our crews daily to ensure compliance. Upon recei pt of your letter, l called a company meeting to address the compl ai nt.

Si nce 2018 our summer uniformed shirt, which all of our field employees are required to wear, has -- sorry, l di dn't mean that. Sorry about the "no leaf bl ower" shirt, whi ch we have.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: For the
record, they did --

ANDREA BOYER: "No leaf bl ower is used
fromJune 15 to Sept enber 15 l ogo and has text on the back of the shirt stating that the empl oyee is trained in all aspects of the Cambridge I eaf bl ower ordi nance.

Each year shirts are distributed to our employees and training sessions just prior to June 15."

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: So based on the response from Cambridge Landscape Company, in addition -- I don't think Ms. Boyer read this, but the empl oyee that -- actually, the grounds foreman al so submitted a statement taking responsibility for doing that, for using the leaf bl ower knowi ngly agai nst the ordi nance, and l would issue a viol ation with a warning.

during the prohi bited times.
So on July 1, 2017, I was jogging al ong
Concord Avenue in the vicinity of 725 Concord
Avenue and I witnessed a truck, it says
Carbone and Son Landscaping and there was several people cleaning up the parking lot and one of them was using a leaf blower.

And then on Jul y 6, 2017, I was joggi ng
in -- by 700 Huron Avenue, which is the Iarge -it is a large apartment building and this has happened for years.

I have seen this company, Ciro Carbone doing Iandscaping work with very Ioud Ieaf bl owers at this complex.

I informed the property manager by going up to the front desk.

On this date I did that and I made a compl ai nt to the front desk, so hopef ully they wrote it down and informed them that their

I andscaping crew should not be using a leaf
bl ower. However, the person using it just
continued to use it even after l spoke with the I andscaper that was using the leaf blower.

CHAI R NI COLE MURATI FERRER: Thank you.
Ms. Boyer, where did we get the address?
Because Mr. Abrams just said Ciro Carbone but this is Carbone Landscape Company. Did we confirmit is the same company?

ANDREA BOYER: If it was, like, a search, would have used a search engi ne to see.
