


Agenda Cambridge COVID-19 Expert Advisory Panel 2 pm, Tuesday May 19th, 2020



1) Protocol for information to be given to people who test virus-positive:

Are they told to seek medical attention?

Do they receive a link to home care information?

What is the quarantine information they are given?

Has anyone reached out to find housing sites for well breadwinners living in a COVID+household, per Louann's idea?

Other recommendations?

2) Symptoms and transmission among children.

New data, recommend adding information on city COVID-19 e-mails and sharing with childcare and home daycare centers.

3) Opening Mem. Drive.

Is it possible to have a mobile testing site there?

Would be educational for reminding people of the risk and offering important service and key missing data set on outdoor transmission, if done properly (eg there are many individuals who self-report to interact only when outdoors exercising together and so they could be tested together on a repeated basis). If this is a possibility, we can find scientists to direct the study and apply for funding).

4) Data on quality of serology tests is becoming available.

When needed by city, we can do a literature review to check latest best methods.
