 - 988 national number established last July to try and address needs of people who think they have behavioral health issues whether they are in crisis or not
 - o 24 hour crisis service: 833-222-2030
 - o Local number directly to CHA from our local communities
- Language Capacity?
 - Goal is for staff to match the community that we serve
 - Representative of several languages spoken within the city
- FAQ 1-Pager exists any feedback/support appreciated materials can be easily changed and updated
