- Neal Michaels introduced the Family Policy Council Work Plan Addressing the Opportunity Gaps in Cambridge document
- Nancy Tauber outlined the document
- Strategy #1: Find It Cambridge
 - Find It is launched
 - 151 Organizations
 - 255 Programs and Events
 - Hector and Nancy facilitated workshops with outreach workers and OST staff (at the Agenda for Children Symposium)
 - Find It Outpost working group met and will meet 2 more times
 - Determine what will be needed to become a Find It Outpost
 - Present ideas to FPC at January meeting
 - Inviting Family Childcare providers
 - Claude Jacob asked how outreach can be connected to the Housing Authority
- Strategy #2: Connect Cambridge Kids
 - Strategies:
 - Gather info from existing systematic efforts aimed at supporting and connecting children and teens with opportunities available in Cambridge and identify key transition points
 - Work with others engaged in this work
 - Support a shared student data system in order to help everyone who works with children, teens, and their families
- Annie Leavitt presented on the Middle School Network
 - Records are kept in ASPEN so CRLS staff have access to OST programs students have participated in
- Lace Campbell raised the idea of potential linkages between Find It Outposts and MSN
- Annie suggested buttons/pins that say “Ask me about other programs” for MSN staff to wear
- Claude Jacobs suggested that school nurses be engaged in this work
 - CPD Safety Net too?
- Ellen Semonoff said we should look to where are the places and what are the ways we can support kids better. Look to places that already have robust relationships with those we are trying to reach

- CPD Youth Outreach Officers very involved with MSN—even take part in summer placement seminars
- Mannika Bowman suggested sharing data with OST and summer program staff to support their program design so that their summer program supports their academics and combats summer “learning loss”
