CDD Receives Technical Assistant Grant for Emergency Preparedness

The City of Cambridge's Community Development Department has been approved to receive a technical assistance grant from the Massachusetts Municipal Association Council (MAPC) which will enable MAPC Municipal Services staff to assist the city's Economic Development Division in undertaking emergency preparedness and post disaster recovery planning with the Cambridge small business community. The goal is for Cambridge small businesses to prepare for and recover from both natural and man-made disasters through the creation of business continuity workshops; development of partnership(s) with local banking and insurance institutions; creation of a blueprint for a non-profit foundation to manage streamlined revolving loans/grants for businesses; and development of implementation plans for the creation of Cambridge Emergency Operations Team.
