




City of Cambridge Population: 2010


Age by Year 2000 and 2010: 0 to 17



Population 65 & Older: 1960 - 2010



 - United States 13.0%



Neighborhood Diversity: 2010






Asian Household Population: 2010



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

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Household Trends: 1980 – 2010



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
Education Comparison: 2010- 2012

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What do we mean by "Poverty"?

Persons in poverty live in a household earning less than the following amount during the year:

Household Size	2011 Poverty Threshold
1 person	\$11,484
2 persons	\$14,657
3 persons	\$17,916
4 persons	\$23,021
5 persons	\$27,251

By definition, dormitory and other group quarters residents do not fall under poverty thresholds.

What do Cambridge residents typically earn during a year?

Here are the Median and Per Capita incomes for Cambridge during 2009-11:

Per Capita Income	\$44,598
