




Population Trend: 1980 - 2010



City of Cambridge Population: 2010





Population 65 & Older: 1960 - 2010




- In 2010 the percentage of elderly in Cambridge ranks 21st smallest in the state.
- Other Areas:
 - Boston 10.1%, ranks 32nd
 - Belmont 15.8%, ranks 225th
 - Watertown 15.0%, ranks 204
 - Somerville 9.1%, ranks 13th
 - Massachusetts 13.8%, unchanged from 2000, 33rd among states
 - United States 13.0%

Youths: 1960 - 2010 & Births: 1991 - 2010




Youth Age by Year: 2000 and 2010




Youths by Census Tract: 2010


Black Household Population by Age by Sex: 2010




Black Household Population: 2010 - 2012



Asian Household Population by Ethnicity: 2010




Hispanic Household Population by Origin: 2010

Native and Foreign Born Residents: 2010 - 2012






Haitian Population: 2008 - 2012




Portuguese Groups: 2008 - 2012




Disability Status: 2010 - 2012




Disability & Employment: 2010 - 2012






Living Arrangements of Children: 2010




Household Comparison: 2010




Families with Children Comparison: 2010




Education Comparison: 2010- 2012




Educational Attainment: 2010 - 2012





Households by Percent Median Income: 2000 and 2006-10




Income by Race: 2010 - 2012

Elder Income by Sex: 2008 - 2010




What do we mean by “Poverty”?

Persons in poverty live in a household earning less than the following amount during the year:


Household Size	2012 Poverty Threshold
1 person	\$11,720
2 persons	\$14,937
3 persons	\$18,284
4 persons	\$23,492
5 persons	\$27,827

By definition, dormitory and other group quarters residents do not fall under poverty thresholds.

Individual Poverty Rates: 2000 vs. 2010-12




Poverty by Race: 2010-12




Childhood Poverty: 2000 and 2010-12




Family Poverty: 2000 and 2010-12
