Mission Statement

 To provide academically excellent, time-efficient, and costeffective higher education for a diverse population of adult learners for whom those opportunities may have been limited or denied.

2013-2014 Facts

- Degrees/certificates awarded in academic year 2013: 1,383
- Student Levels: 33% Undergraduate, 67% Graduate
- AY13 Degree Seeking Students: 4,929
 - Undergraduate -1,607
 - Graduate 3,322
- Average Student Age: 36 years old
- Gender: 70% female, 30% male
- Diversity: 51% minority
- Alumni: more than 33,500
- Majority of students live outside of Greater Boston in outlying towns such as: Chelsea, East Bridgewater, Everett, Newton, Woburn and Franklin.

Sites across Massachusetts and the country

- Massachusetts base and headquarters
 - Cambridge almost 2800 students
 - Lawrence serving students for over 11 years, located just off Rte.
 495
 - Springfield serving students for over 21 years, located just off Interstate 91
- Puerto Rico serving students for 16 years in the San Juan region
- Southern California serving students for 9 years
- Southern States slated for closure in 2015 include Georgia,
 Tennessee, and Virginia

Physical Plant in Cambridge 80 Prospect Street

- Lease expired July 2014
- Relocate two schools located in facility
- Provides cost savings and window to develop a more thorough physical master plan strategy

17 Monsignor O'Brien Hwy

- Lease expires 8/31/2017
- Relocated School of Education
- Negotiate full building tenancy including additional parking spaces
- Student parking [mostly evening] accommodated at the Cambridgeside Galleria and the Museum of Science

1000 Massachusetts Avenue

- Relocated School of Psych & Counseling
- Included creation of a new on-site parking plan to accommodate more students
