

Hubway Bike Share in Cambridge

Bike share stations are coming to Cambridge in summer, 2012. The City is currently working to implement the next phase of the Hubway bike share system, which will continue the network of bike share stations in the Boston metro area, expand efficient transportation choices, and promote convenient bike options throughout the city. The initial phase of the project will include the installation of 24 bike sharing systems, but with your help, we will be able to expand the system to additional places throughout the City of Cambridge.



Where Will the Stations Be Located?

The City is in the process of determining bike share station locations for the first phase of the project (the first 24 stations). Please check our website in the coming months for a map of station locations.

Can the City Place a Station Near My Business?

All bike share stations are open to the public but having one near your front door is a great opportunity to support your employees or bring tourists and customers to your business.

The City welcomes partners who can fund the purchase, installation and maintenance of stations. Donors will be publicly acknowledged on the station, on the website, and in other materials. Station names will be relevant to the site and chosen by mutual agreement between donors and the City.

What Do Stations Cost?

The total cost of equipment, installation, and 3-years of operation and maintenance (O+M) for a standard bike share station is approximately \$92,000.

Arrangements can be made to pay over three years, with the equipment, installation, and first year of O+M costs paid up front and the second and third years of O+M paid later.

What Do the Stations Look Like?

Bike share stations can be located on private or public property and are strategically placed throughout the city. A standard station consists of 19 bike docking stations and 10 bikes. The stations are solar powered and will also include a kiosk for purchases and a two-sided information panel with maps and instructions.
