#### Legislative Action on State Laws for Massachusetts to Improve Bicyclist Safety

Transmitting a request from MassBike:

I am writing to ask you to email your state legislators to co-sponsor the Vulnerable Road Users bill and the Bicycle Lane Protection bill written by MassBike and filed by Senator Brownsberger.

The "Act To Protect Vulnerable Roads Users", S.D. 723, will strongly encourage motorists to exercise more caution when operating around vulnerable road users, will educate motorists to operate more safely, and will provide law enforcement with additional tools to protect vulnerable road users. The bill

defines "vulnerable users" to include pedestrians, bicyclists, and others including wheelchair users, all non-motorized users, and horseback riders. The bill enhances the fines applicable to motorists who kill or seriously injure vulnerable users, and requires traffic safety education and community service components. The bill also includes a harassment component that makes it illegal to physically harass a vulnerable user with a motor vehicle, and provides civil recourse for a wide range of harassing behavior. With the tragic string of bicyclist fatalities in 2012, the need for strong laws to encourage motorists to be more careful around vulnerable users is clear.

The "Act To Protect Bicyclists In Bicycle Lanes", S.D. 731, makes it a violation statewide for the driver of a motor vehicle to park or stand in a marked bicycle lane or other on-street bicycle facility. When a motor vehicle parks or stands in a bike lane, it endangers bicyclists by causing them to move out of the bike lane into traffic to avoid the parked vehicle, or squeeze between the parked vehicle and the curb or other parked cars. In most communities in Massachusetts, it is not clearly a violation to park in a bike lane. While the City of Boston has recognized the problem and adopted its own ordinance, we run the risk of a patchwork of inconsistent and confusing local laws if we do not act statewide.

#### **Grand Junction Pathway**



The City has completed a feasibility study to determine whether it is possible to create a Rail-With-Trail (RWT) along this corridor. A RWT would enable the railroad to continue its services, with a separated trail functioning parallel to the rail. The proposed Grand Junction RWT would serve pedestrians, bicyclists, joggers, and others as a recreational and transportation route, linking various Cambridge neighborhoods and other recreational facilities and serving major employment and university centers.
