The Community Learning Center (CLC) offers free classes for adults in the morning, afternoon, and evening.

For registration information, call 617-349-6363 or come to the CLC Monday-Thursday 9:00 am - 8:30 pm or Friday 9:00 am - 5:00 pm.

Eligible applicants are given an interview and diagnostic test to decide on the best class placement.

ESOL: English for Speakers of Other Languages

We offer 7 levels of English conversation, grammar, reading, and writing.

Reading, Writing, and Mathematics / High School Equivalency Preparation

We have classes at 4 levels, from beginning reading and math to high school level. The High School Equivalency program prepares students to pass the HiSET, which is given at an official test center.

Tutoring

Enrolled students have the opportunity to meet one-on-one with a tutor for extra help with class work.

Advising

Educational and career advising is provided to all students to help and support them during the time they are enrolled in classes. With the assistance of our advisors, students develop an education and career plan and are guided to “next steps” after completing the program.

Computer Instruction

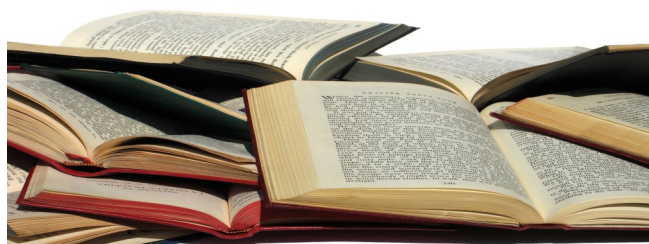
Students enrolled in other CLC classes can practice their reading, writing, and math skills on a computer and learn basic computer operations and word processing skills.

CHA Gateways

English for speakers of other languages and computer classes are offered at the Jefferson Park Housing Development. Preference is given to Cambridge public housing or voucher tenants. Enrollment is continuous throughout the year. Call Felipe Vaquerano at 617-497-4411.

A family literacy class for parents of Cambridge children is offered at the Peabody School in the morning. In addition to studying English, students learn how to help their children succeed in school, hear from guest speakers on parenting topics, and participate in interactive literacy activities with their children. Healthcare Training Programs

In collaboration with the Academy for Health Care Training, the Rindge School of Technical Arts, the Cambridge Employment Program and five healthcare employers, CLC offers training programs for immigrants who want to start a career as Home Health Aides and/or CNAs. The programs offer integrated education and training by providing simultaneous basic skills and job skills instruction, as well as clinical training and practicum to prepare students to pass the relevant state exam. Citizenship
