PHILOSOPHY

The Elm Street Summer Camp Experience fosters an inclusive child centered environment that is safe, friendly, and fun. During our weekly themed curriculum we incorporate an emphasis on character traits that builds social and emotional skills for our campers. We believe our campers will build lifelong friendships.

AGES

Our camp serves children who have completed one year of Kindergarten up through entering the 5th grade. Children will be grouped by age to allow them to participate in age appropriate activities.

VISUAL & PERFORMING ARTS

Campers will have the opportunity to explore a variety of arts and crafts in the camp and at the ARTS IN THE PARK program located in Sennott Park. They will participate in performances by local children’s entertainers in music, magic and dance from diverse cultural backgrounds.

SPORTS

Swimming Lessons, Floor Hockey, Basketball, Tee Ball, Scooter Sports, Soccer and other sport related activities are incorporated into each week.

STAFF

Camp staff are trained in inclusion, age appropriate curriculum development, first aid and CPR.

FIELD TRIPS

New England Patriots Training Camp, Southwick’s Zoo, Pirate Cruise, Davis Farmland, Museums, Beach Trips and Library trips are just a few examples of weekly trips.

LUNCH & SNACK

A healthy morning and afternoon snack will be provided. All campers must bring a daily lunch.

PAYMENT

\$50 deposit is required for each session at registration. Deposit is applied to tuition and is not refundable after Friday, May 26th. Payment must be made one week prior to each camp session. Payments must be made by check or money order payable to the Elm Street Community School. **Registration begins 6 p.m. on March 16th at the Cambridgeport School located on 89 Elm Street and ongoing after the initial sign up night for the remaining camp slots.**

FINANCIAL AID

Limited financial aid is available for eligible families. Income documentation of W2 form or 4 week paystubs are required. Application for Financial Aid must be received by Friday, May 12th. We accept **CHILD CARE CHOICES OF BOSTON Vouchers**.

LICENSING

This camp must comply with regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (105cmr430.00) and licensed by the Cambridge Board of Health.
