Compete in friendly team games and relays. Celebrate with us at our End of Summer Picnic in the Park!

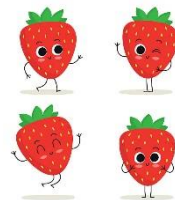


Equal Access

Our Philosophy

Strawberry Hill Camp provides children with creative, social, educational and athletic activities in a safe, nurturing environment. Our staff members respect individual differences by embracing diversity and using it as a tool to teach youth that community is not just a word, but a way of life.

Camp Activities

Children will participate in literacy activities such as story time, creative writing and library visits, cooking, creative arts and environmental exploration. Field trips will include visits to museums, zoos, and local landmarks along with weekly beach trips. On a daily basis, children will be able to choose and participate in various activities including recreational sports, nature at Fresh Pond, water play, arts and crafts and group games. All age levels participate in weekly tennis and swim lessons. Healthy morning and afternoon snacks are provided.

Children must bring daily bag lunch.

Age Requirements

Children should be 4.5 years of age (entering Kindergarten in September) through 10 years of age. Children will be separated into age-appropriate groups.

Camp Dates & Tuition

Extended Day

Children who stay for extended day have had a long, busy and often tiring day at camp; therefore, the mood in the afternoon session is relaxed and casual. Story time, board games, computer workshop, crafts and low-exertion physical activities are some of the choices offered.

Staff

Our staff are committed childcare professionals with extensive experience in promoting socially responsible behavior in youth. They design and implement age-appropriate recreational and enrichment activities for children. The camp is run by a director and includes specialists in various fields, including dance, visual arts, sports and environmental exploration. All classrooms consist of a lead counselor and two assistant counselors. All counselors are supported by youth from the Mayor's Summer Program. All of our lead counselors are CPR and First Aid certified and have received extensive training in curriculum development and needs of youth. Certified lifeguards accompany us on all beach trips.



Registration

Registration begins on March 20th with ongoing registration on a space available basis. A non-refundable \$25 registration fee is required for each child upon registration.

Payments & Financial Assistance

A \$100.00 deposit per 2 week session per child is required to reserve a space. Deposits are applied towards tuition. Full payment must be received one week prior to the start of each session. Cancellations must be received no later than May 25th. After that date, no refunds will be granted. All payments must be made by check or money order payable to: HAGGERTY COMMUNITY SCHOOL.

Financial assistance is available for eligible families.

Income verification in the form of 4 weeks of pay stubs is required.

All requests for financial assistance must be received by Friday, May 11th.

Childcare Choices of Boston vouchers are accepted.
