





Children with disabilities participate in all out-of-school time (OST) DHSP programs: Community Schools, Youth Programs, Child Care, and Recreation.


DHSP has a full time Inclusion Specialist who supports program staff as well as families and individual children.

The Parent Inclusionary Effort enables the department to listen to the voices of families.





HELPING YOUR CHILD TO BE SUCCESSFUL IN AN OUT-OF-SCHOOL TIME PROGRAM:

We encourage families to speak to DHSP program staff about their child's strengths, interests and needs on a regular basis.


