

ELIGIBILITY:

DHSP welcomes individuals with disabilities who meet the basic eligibility requirements of the out-of-school time programs or who with the provision of reasonable accommodations will be able to meet the basic eligibility requirements.

All children participating in out-of-school time Programs either with the provision of the additional supports or independently need to be able and willing to:

- Participate in group activities
- Understand and follow program rules and conduct themselves safely and appropriately in a group setting
- Successfully transition from one activity to another

Reasonable accommodations might include reasonable modifications to a program's rules, policies, or practices, the provision of auxiliary aids and services, written materials in alternative formats, alteration or removal of physical or transportation barriers.

DHSP may in some circumstances provide additional staffing up to and including a one-on-one aide to an individual with a disability who would not be able to participate in the program without such assistance, but who will be able to meet the basic eligibility requirements of the program to which he or she has applied if such assistance is provided. All such determinations will be made on a case-by-case basis.

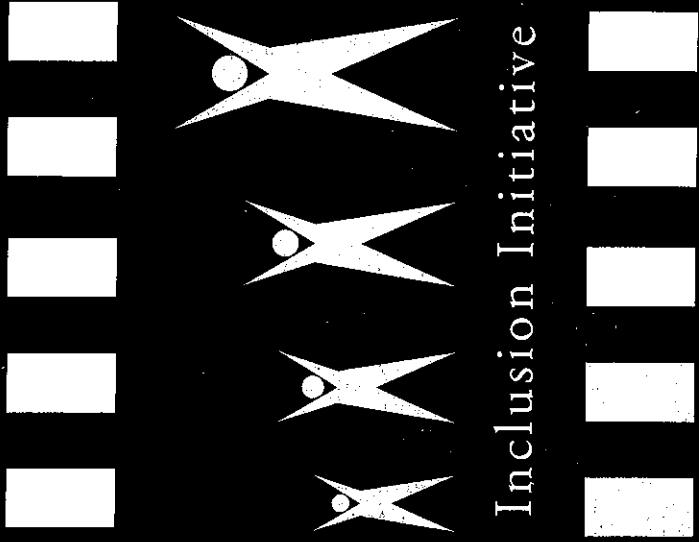

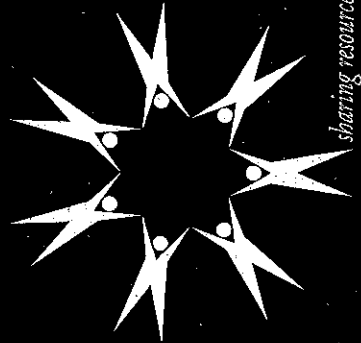

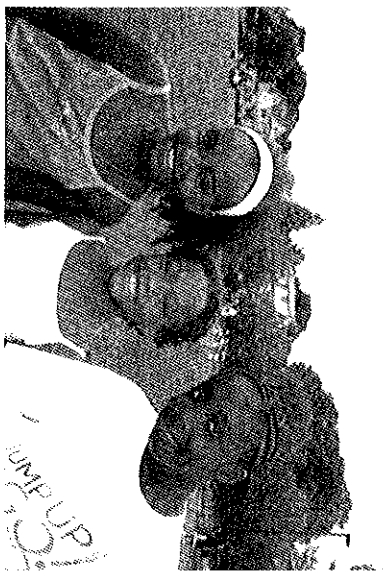

Children with disabilities participate in all out-of-school time (OST) DHSP programs: Community Schools, Youth Programs, Child Care, and Recreation.

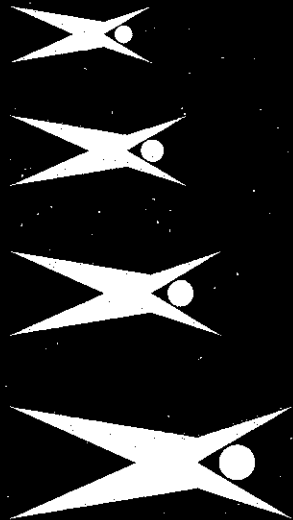
DHSP has a full time Inclusion Specialist who supports program staff as well as families and individual children.

All staff receive comprehensive training on inclusion. This allows them to incorporate the best inclusion strategies in their programs.

All staff follow Positive Behavior Support Methods. This creates a safe and respectful community.

Knowledgeable consultants offer staff onsite modeling and coaching.

The Parent Inclusionary Effort enables the department to listen to the voices of families.



HELPING YOUR CHILD TO BE SUCCESSFUL IN AN OUT-OF-SCHOOL TIME PROGRAM:

The Team Approach

Teams work best when they are in regular contact and share information and materials as often as possible. The team includes you, your child, your child's classroom teacher, the specialists working with your child, DHSP program staff and the DHSP Inclusion specialist.

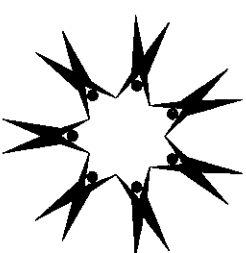
We encourage families to speak to DHSP program staff about their child's strengths, interests and needs on a regular basis.
