 - Mayor Maher introduced new members of the Kids' Council
 - Claude Jacob is now an official voting member of the Kids' Council

- Mayor Maher asked returning members of the Kids' Council to introduce themselves
- Announcements/Updates
 - Dwayne Green described the work of the 2014-2015 Youth Council
 - developed mentoring program, in which high school students mentored eighth graders
 - "Beyond the Walkout" workshop series
 - Basketball game: Youth vs. City officials
 - Attended National League of Cities Conference
 - Dwayne described the goal of the 2015-2016 Youth Council as to empower youth to take charge of their own education
 - Nancy Tauber announced the 2015 Kids' Council Meeting Schedule: same time and place (5:15-7:15 344 Broadway), 3rd Thursday of the month – October, November, January, March, May, June
 - Michelle Godfrey discussed the Summer 2015 Book Bike program
 - This summer the program bought an additional Book Bike with the help of the Kids' Council
 - Expanded from 3 to 5 parks in Cambridge
 - Gave 2603 books to Cambridge youth this summer
 - Mayor Maher announced that Griffin Andres was elected by his peers to represent Cambridge students on the School Committee
 - Mayor Maher announced that tomorrow is PARKing Day in the City of Cambridge
 - Mayor Maher's Food Drive will take place in a parking space directly in front of City Hall
 - \circ $\,$ Mayor Maher announced that the search for a new superintendent is continuing
 - 19-person interview committee has been formed
 - Training starts 9/29
 - Interviews conducted 10/5, 10/6
 - > 57 applicants so far
 - Mike Payack announced that the Cambridge Charrette on Homelessness is ongoing this week
 - DHSP, in consultation with the Cambridge Homeless Continuum of Care (CoC) and other City departments, has partnered with the Corporation

for Supportive Housing (CSH) to facilitate a community planning process to inform the City's strategic plan on homelessness

- A steering committee comprised of a diverse group of stakeholders used input from the public received during two community meetings held in June to identify six issue areas to be addressed during Charrette Week
- On Tuesday and Wednesday, September 15 and 16, each issue area had a dedicated two-hour fishbowl-style session, a facilitated dialogue between community members and local and national experts
- CSH will present their recommendations (based on various input received during Charrette Week) to the community this Friday, September 18, at 10 am, at the YWCA in Central Square
 - Members of the community will have an opportunity to once again provide feedback immediately following the presentation
 - > Mike announced that all are welcome to attend this presentation
- Alanna Mallon announced that the Cambridge Backpack Program received State funding (\$110,000) this year to expand the program
 - Backpack Program has combined with RSTA Program at CRLS
 - > Will be combined with Food Justice Program in RSTA
 - RSTA students will help prepare the food
- Adoption of Minutes (May 21, 2015 meeting)
 - Michelle Godfrey moved to adopt the minutes for the May 21, 2015 meeting
 - Neal Michaels seconded motion
 - Minutes adopted

- Nancy Tauber provided two announcements
 - Kids' Council received grant from Google (\$22,360) to fund Find It "Finders"
 - Code For Boston organizer will present their work on the Find It Cambridge website at the Code For America Summit next month

- Leo Burd presented the dynamic wireframe for Find It Cambridge
 - See Attachment A for detail
- The developers are looking for Cambridge parents to test the usability of the website
 - Developers ask for testers' first impressions, to try out certain tasks, to think out loud as they navigate the website
 - Usability tests generally last about an hour

- Suggestions from Kids' Council members
 - Create linkages between Find It Cambridge and the CPSD website (i.e. for high school athletic schedules)
 - Create linkages from CHA website to Find It Cambridge
 - CHA website is heavily visited
 - Include CHA in outreach efforts for Find It Cambridge when it is launched
 - Secure commitment from agencies (especially larger agencies) to add their program, event information to Find It Cambridge
 - Should business associations add info about events they organize?
 - Add section of website dedicated to resources, programs for individuals with disabilities
 - Make accessibility a searchable field
 - Develop a convenient and helpful way to search for programs that are free, have sliding scale fees, or scholarship or financial aid available
 - Despite the challenge of the many different ways that programs manage affordability—and the different terminology this causes
 - Talk with the City's Community Development Department about access to their address/property database
 - Seek buy-in and user feedback from youth
 - Add info about youth jobs
 - Think about a way to differentiate young adults from kids
 - Teenagers do not want to be thought of as "kids"
 - Think about a way to make the site attractive for youth to use themselves (not only parents)
 - The branding could help
 - Is there a need among youth for such a tool?
 - We haven't formally assessed this
- Developer Feedback
 - Create MVP (Minimal Viable Product) and make adjustments and improvements from user feedback and analytics (i.e. what are users searching for that is not currently available?)
 - Product does not have to be perfect at launch

Questions for the Dynamic Wireframe

- Is there anything missing in terms of content?
- Do the names make sense?
- Does the navigation make sense?
- Is there anything that should receive more/less attention than something else?

Core Activities

- Search for providers, services, programs, and events
 - by age/grade appropriateness
 - by location
 - by date and time
- Browse for content by topic
- Evaluate programs for relevance, eligibility, and accessibility* (location, cost, special needs)
- Request to be notified of timely information via alerts and updates

Questions

- How will we know people are using the site and it is making a difference? Who is using the site?
- We know we need someone to be the Find It Project Manager. Will we also need someone to update the actual system who has more technical skills? What will that entail?
- How will we officially launch Find It?
- Other?
