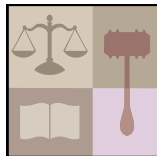

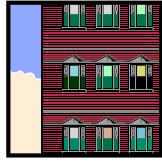

*I just got a 14-day notice to quit. What should I do?*

This is the formal notice your landlord must give you to let you know that he/she is **starting** the eviction process. It is issued when a landlord claims that you owe back rent. In many cases you will have the right to pay the back rent to avoid eviction. Gather your documents and call or visit one of the agencies listed above or one of the legal agencies listed in this brochure **as soon as possible**.



*I am a homeowner and can no longer afford my mortgage payment. What can I do?*
