





Cambridge 2012 Serious Crime* Review

Crime in Cambridge Continues Historic Decline with 3,478 Part I Index Crimes Reported

Again this year, the Cambridge Police Department is proud to report another historic drop in crime across the city. The 3,478 serious crimes recorded in Cambridge during 2012 represented the lowest total of index crimes reported to the FBI since Congress enacted the Omnibus Crime Control Act in 1968. **The 3% decrease in Part 1 offenses in Cambridge in 2012 translates to 89 fewer people being victimized by crime.** 2012 marks the fourth year in a row that Cambridge saw a drop in violent crime, resulting in 22 less victims of these most traumatic crimes.

Analysis of 2012 Serious Crime in Cambridge


A detailed analysis of all statistics indicates there were 67 fewer property crimes counted in Cambridge during 2012, to register a 2% decrease when compared with 2011. When measured against the 5-year weighted average**, the 2012 property crime total was down 2%. Violent crime in Cambridge was down 5% in 2012, with twenty two fewer incidents than 2011. Compared to the 5-year weighted average for violent crime in this city, violent crime fell 6%.

A dramatic 53% reduction in commercial robbery, a 4% drop in residential burglary, and 26% fewer auto thefts contributed significantly to the 3% drop in crime in 2012 when compared to 2011.

Some of the more significant trends identified when analyzing the crime totals in Cambridge for 2012 were that housebreaks registered a decrease of 4% when compared with 2011. The drop in larceny of motor vehicles, at 39% below the 5-year weighted average, was a major factor in the falling property crime rate. The final significant contributing factor to the 3% crime reduction in 2012 was the dramatic drop in commercial robbery. With only 16 incidents reported all year, this 53% reduction accounts for most of the 5% drop in violent crime.

The crime of larceny from a person (more commonly referred to as pickpocketing) was the crime with the most significant increase in reported incidents in Cambridge during 2012. Despite numerous arrests of professional pick-pockets, including several successful undercover operations by detectives, this crime increased by 15% and accounted for 48 more incidents than were seen in 2011.

Although thefts from motor vehicles increased by 7% this year, the 686 incidents reported were still 17% below the 5-year average, and nearly half of the 1,234 reported in 2007.
