



❄️ Let's all dig in and dig out:

Ice and snow free sidewalks are everyone's responsibility

SHOVEL:

- ❄️ Shovel your sidewalk on all sides of your property, down to bare pavement.
- ❄️ Make path at least 3 feet wide.
- ❄️ Chop or melt all ice.

CLEAR:

- ❄️ Clear ramps at corners and crosswalks.
- ❄️ Keep street drains clear of snow.

REMEMBER TO:


- ❄️ Remove snow from all sidewalks next to property within 12 hours after snow stops falling during the day, and before 1 p.m. when snow has fallen overnight.
- ❄️ Remove or melt ice within 6 hours of the time that it forms.

TO AVOID A VIOLATION:

- ❄️ If you do not comply, you will be in violation of City Ordinance and may be fined \$50 per violation per day.

REACH OUT TO NEIGHBORS:

- ❄️ Are there neighbors on your street who are elderly, have a disability, or may have difficulty shoveling for any reason?
- ❄️ Work with your neighbors to ensure your entire block is safe and accessible for all!



REMEMBER:



You are always responsible for making sure your sidewalks get cleared of snow and ice even if you are on vacation. Make arrangements in advance!

Low-income homeowners who are elderly or have a disability may qualify for the City's Snow Exemption Program (in which case, the City will clear your sidewalk). To apply, call 617-349-6220 (voice) or 617-349-6050 (TTY).
