Footnotes:

1. *The category "Some Other Race" indicates that the respondent either selected the "Some Other Race" category or wrote in a category not included elsewhere by the Census Bureau. Examples of responses coded as "Some Other Race" include various Hispanic groups, multiracial, mixed, Cajun, Cape Verdean and Creole.*
2. *Indicates that a respondent selected more than one race category.*
3. *Hispanic ethnicity is independent of race and reflects whether a respondent has origins in either Spain or the Spanish speaking regions of the western hemisphere. The later include Puerto Rico, Mexico, Cuba and the Dominican Republic, as well as all Spanish speaking countries located in Central America and South America.*
4. *Percentages are share of Non-White and/or Hispanic population, rather than total population.*
