- 1. Hult Business School figures reflect the number of employed persons, not FTEs.
- 2. Harvard and MIT staff figures include post-doctoral fellows. Harvard figures also include teaching assistants, employed graduate students and interns. MIT figures also include certain contractors who are employed full time at MIT facilities providing services to the university. Cambridge College regards an FTE as equivalent to 1.33 full time positions.
- 3. Lesley University adjuncts counted as five adjuncts equivalent to one FTE.
- 4. While more than 90% of Cambridge College weekday classes occur after 5:00 P. M., a few students attend classes before that time. However, all Cambridge College students are treated as evening students.
- Lesley University figure includes participants in professional development seminars and institutes lasting up to twenty days over the course of a year.
- 6. Harvard and MIT Post-Doctoral fellows also counted as staff.
- 7. Harvard figures do not include Extension School students.
- 8. MIT total includes students housed in dormitories, fraternities, sororities and independent living groups. Lesley University undergraduate total includes Threshold students, who are not enrolled in a typical college program.
- Affiliate housing refers to housing owned by the institution and generally available only to members of the academic community; it does not include either dormitories or housing available for rent to persons not affiliated with the institution.
- 10. The Cambridge College facility consist of a single parcel with a mix of tax exempt and taxable uses, all of which is included in the tax exempt figures.
- 11. The Hult International School of Business is a nonprofit arm of the Efekta Schools, Inc. (EF). Hult leases all its space from EF. Due to the relationship between Hult and EF the school's facilities are included both under property owned and leased.
- 12. Harvard figures reflect corrections to prior year reports.
- 13. MIT figure includes only tax exempt buildings.
- 14. Harvard University Institutional/Academic figure includes classrooms, all office space, libraries, laboratories, and the assembly/museum category found in the Town Gown report.
- 15. Harvard University Student Activities/Athletic figure includes all support facilities, including those categorized as athletic, health care, and support.
- 16. Harvard Dormitory/Nontaxable Residential figure includes taxable residential properties.
- 17. MIT Commercial figure includes only rentable floor area.
- 18. MIT did not provide a figure for Taxable Residential. Figure stated for MIT assumes 1,000 square feet per unit for 163 units owned. Harvard Taxable Residential GFA included in Dormitory/Nontaxable Residential figure.
- 19. Information for 18 Mellen Street leased by Lesley University comes from the Cambridge Assessor's Database.
- 20. Lesley University uses athletic facilities owned by Buckingham Brown & Nichols School. No square foot figure is stated for these playing fields.
- 21. MIT owns ground leases at 100 Memorial Drive and University Park. Structures are owned by others and not reported here.
- 22. MIT figure includes units occupied by both MIT and non-MIT residents
- 23. Cambridge College student spaces are used as employee parking during the day and are only available to students between 6:00 P. M. and 11:00 P. M.
- 24. Harvard University parking stock floats between employee, visitor, and student use, per the PTDM Plan approved by the City. Lesley figures exclude spaces assigned to commercial and residential tenants.
- 25. City of Cambridge Fiscal Year 16 covers the period from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.
- 26. MIT figure also includes taxes paid on MIT-owned property through ground leases as well as taxes paid by independent living groups.

27. PILOT refers to Payment in Lieu of taxes.
