



# Harvard's Approach to **Sustainable Development**


Accelerating action at the intersection of climate, equity, and health.





#### **How We Power**


- Goal Zero: Fossil Fuel-Free by 2050: Harvard is accelerating a fossil fuel-free world, aiming to power all campus operations without the use of fossil fuels by 2050
- To accomplish Goal Zero, all of Harvard is engaged in actively planning and taking steps to achieve a fossil fuel-free future





#### **How We Power**


- Fossil Fuel-Neutral by 2026: As a bridge to reach Goal Zero,
   Harvard has a short-term objective to be fossil fuel-neutral
   by 2026
- Harvard will continue to prioritize energy efficiency, while balancing its remaining campus emissions through renewable energy purchases and investing in projects that offset both greenhouse gas emissions and the health impacts of our use of fossil fuels



#### **Harvard Healthier Building Academy**

Translating research into practice and institutionalizing standards Harvard-wide.





#### Supply/Value Chain (Scope 3) Emissions

- Holistic approach to Harvard's supply chain impacts
- Actively piloting solutions to reduce these emissions





#### **On-Site Renewable Energy: 3 MW**

- Harvard has a total of 31 solar PV projects in the Greater Boston area
- ~2.7 million kWh produced per year, equivalent of powering 250 American homes for one year







#### The Salata Institute for Climate and Sustainability

- Launched in fall 2022
- Established to catalyze research programs across Harvard's vast community of scholars, students, practitioners, and staff

#### **Supporting Cambridge Public Schools**

- Harvard's educational programs are available in every CPS school
- Curriculum-based programs in STEM, arts & culture, and humanities
- Professional Development Opportunities for CPS Educators
- Family Engagement and Parent Workshops

#### **Cambridge Students Accepted to Harvard**

28 students from Cambridge were accepted to Harvard College last year.





#### **Housing Support for Cambridge Residents**

- Long-standing collaboration with Cambridge Housing Authority
- Recommitted \$20M to the Harvard Local Housing Collaborative
  - The fund has helped leverage \$1.3 billion in housing development

#### **Housing for Harvard Students & Affiliates**

- Planning to construct 500+ beds locally for Harvard affiliates
- 99% of undergraduates live in dorms on campus
- Strategic interventions to create graduate student housing in Cambridge





# **Community Support and Equity Initiatives Across Cambridge**

- Helping to address food insecurity in partnership with Food for Free
  - 2000+ meals distributed weekly
- Supporting minority and women-owned businesses in Harvard Square
  - ~50% of the retail tenants leasing space in Harvard-owned buildings in Cambridge are minority or women-owned
  - 90%+ of tenants are independently-owned businesses
- Pro bono legal services for Cambridge residents
- Mayor's Winter Support Drive
- RISE Program
  - Guaranteed Income Pilot Program for low-income Cambridge residents
