




Who We're Hearing From – Survey Highlights





- There is desire for more affordable housing in the neighborhood



What we've heard so far...

- 54% of survey comments about Community Events ask for more ways to get to know neighbors
- Neighbors would like to see more community events, such as events that close the streets to vehicles
- Neighbors would like to see more indoor community spaces

I think having more of the street gatherings where the block is closed off so that people can just meet and eat and get to know one another.

There is one in Neighborhood Nine called the Buena Vista Social Club. That happens every autumn. A few more would be nice too.





1. Make it more comfortable and convenient for people to bike in the neighborhood

What we've heard so far...

- 45% of survey comments about Bikability are about cyclists' safety
- There is appreciation for existing bike connections and protected bike lanes but a call for more safe biking areas



Cambridge has improved biking infrastructure in many ways (which is greatly appreciated), but there are still many gaps on streets with no protected bike lanes.






3. Slow and reduce traffic through the neighborhood and at key intersections

What we've heard so far...

- 40% of survey comments about Traffic Calming concern general safety and 45% concern vehicle traffic
- There is a desire for traffic calming at important intersections in the neighborhood



Expanded bus service, including an east-west connection between Huron Village and Porter Square could help reduce some car trips




APPENDIX

- These neighborhood boundaries likely don't align with lived experience, and that is okay






Why Focus on Neighborhoods?




- Venue for discussions that aren't planned for as part of other City initiatives


