Why Focus on Neighborhoods?




- Venue for discussions that aren't planned for as part of other City initiatives

- Focus on day-to-day





COMMUNITY VISION

Work with community members to create a neighborhood vision and set of goals.

- Understand what it's like to live in the neighborhood.
- Learn how the community thinks we can make the neighborhood better.
- Identify what topics we should focus on in the Action Plan.

July August September

STRATEGY

Work with community members to identify policies and actions to improve the everyday experience of people in the neighborhood.

- Figure out what resources we have available
- Identify which actions and policies will be most effective

October November

DRAFT & PUBLISH

Develop consensus for actions and policies to achieve the community's goals.

- Write the action plan into a document.
- Set a plan to implement the actions.


