

### **Net Zero Transportation Plan**

#### What is the problem we're trying to solve?

- The City Council set a goal for Cambridge to reach net zero emissions by 2050
- We need a plan to remove greenhouse gases from transportation in Cambridge

#### Why are we turning to this group to do that?

- New approach to engagement
- We hope to include many voices—especially people who have been underheard, underserved, and excluded in the past





# **Advisory Group Process**

What we're going to do and how we'll work together

### What did we hear from you?

We spoke to 17 community-based organizations and service providers in Cambridge. Our conversations focused on:

- How people get around Cambridge
- Desired outcomes of the process
- How to address equity & racial justice
- Community involvement in planning processes

### **Advisory Group process: insights from interviews**

- 1. Organizations and community members have limited time
  - We should be flexible with scheduling Advisory Group tasks and meetings
  - Several organizations can support one-off outreach tasks
- 2. Make net zero meaningful for communities
  - While everyone agrees about the importance, saving the planet is not the most pressing issue on the minds of marginalized folks
- 3. Be clear about why the City is making changes & new policies
  - Folks are happier to get on board when they understand why changes are being made
