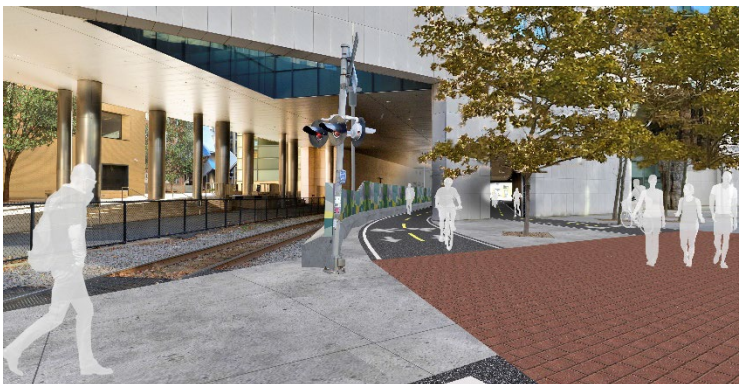
All Working Group meetings are open to the public. The meeting will begin promptly at 5:30 PM and end no later than 7:00 PM.
