Youth Engagement



The Safe Routes to School Program is offered to all 2nd and 6th graders in Cambridge Public Schools.

- 1,900** young people trained in bicycle and pedestrian safety
- 462** elementary school students trained in bicycle and pedestrian skills
- 442** 6th graders trained in advanced on-bicycle skills
- 80** high school students trained in urban cycling and maintenance basics
- 34** youth interns at CDD were taught the basics of urban cycling

Community Engagement

- 432** residents received bicycle education
- 210** riders participated in the May 2019 "Coast the City" Community Bike Ride
- 75** people engaged in the Urban Cycling Basics workshop at the Cambridge Science Festival
- 36** community bike education workshops were held
- 35** people learned how to fix their bike at the May 2019 Fix It Clinic



The Cambridge Bicycle Committee hosts Community bike rides twice a year.

Still to come in June 2019

- 20 Cambridge Youth Programs staff will complete a 3-hour on-bike advanced training course
- 80 Mayor's Youth Summer Employment (MYSEP) staff and interns will complete Urban Cycling Basics to prepare them to model good biking behavior all summer
- 700 MSYEP interns will receive Urban Cycling Basics mini-lessons as part of their summer orientation
